

Title: The Power of Fasting

Scripture: Matthew 6:16-18; Mark 2:18-20; Act 13:2-3

This week's memory verse

Matthew 6:16 (NLT) "And when you fast, don't make it obvious, as the hypocrites do, for they try to look miserable and disheveled so people will admire them for their fasting. I tell you the truth, that is the only reward they will ever get.

Monday

Subject: When Should We Fast?

Scripture: Isaiah 58

Commentary:

Isaiah 58 describes God's objection to the misplaced religious fasting of the people. The people complained when God did not recognize their religious actions, but God responded that their fastings had been only half-hearted at best. They had been going through the fasting motions, but their hearts were far from God. They wrongly had presumed on the grace of God while living lives of blatant moral disobedience. Beginning in verse 6, God expresses His longing for a righteous kind of fasting. When should we fast? (1) When we are caught in a sinful pattern (v.6) (2) When we have a heavy burden (v.6), (3) When we are oppressed by the enemy. (v.6) (4) When we want to give to someone else (v.7) (5) When we need to be encouraged (v.8) (6) When we need answer to prayer (v.9) (7) When we need to examine ourselves (vv.9-10) (8) When we need direction (v.11) (9) When we need spiritual restoration (v.11) and (10) When we need to be revived (v.12). It appears we have little wiggle room for our ignoring this rarely practiced spiritual discipline.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How has this passage helped me to understand the importance of fasting?
- 2. How will this impact the way I approach fasting in the future?

Challenge:

Resolve to at least explore and investigate the discipline of fasting. Commit this to prayer and seek God's guidance in this regard.

Tuesday

Subject: Three Enemies of Prayer

Scripture: 1 Peter 5:5-11

Commentary:

Getting serious about prayer always involves running into resistance. Someone doesn't want you praying without ceasing. Satan uses terrorist tactics to unsettle our lives and distract us from giving our attention to the only in which we are truly secure. Watch out for these 3 enemies of prayer in your life...(1) Anger – When I'm angry, I don't pray or don't want to. Anger can be righteous, but most often it's an unrighteous response to circumstances. Anger is an enemy of prayer. (2) Fear – Fear before real or imagined danger can drive you to prayer but it often raises questions that derail prayer: Will God really come through?? Is He trustworthy? Rather than casting my cares on Him (1 Pet. 5:7), I remain prayer less and afraid. (3) Doubt – We are all prone to doubt, but we shouldn't dwell in it. We ask questions like "Is God really good?" "Is He really listening?" In these times, we must know that we can cast our anxieties to God in prayer and know that He cares for us.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Which of these 3 anxieties do I struggle with most? Why?
- 2. How can I cast these distracting emotions on the Lord as to keep my focus on Him?

Challenge:

Choose not to worry about these things as you commit to the Lord in fervent prayer.

Wednesday

Subject: Find the Armor

Scripture: Ephesians 6:10-12

Commentary:

In this passage, Paul assures the true believer that is living in the Spirit controlled life can be sure to be in a spiritual war. The Lord provides his children with sufficient armor to combat and thwart the advances of our adversary, but we must first know where these are located. In the first few verses, Paul briefly sets forth the basic truths regarding the believer's necessary spiritual preparation as well as truths regarding his enemy, his battle, and his victory. We must be fervent partakers in God's word to help us first find the armor. Find the armor... now put on the armor.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How have I searched for God's armor in order to be able to withstand the attacks of the enemy?
- 2. How can I be more fervent in my pursuit of God's word in order to know the "strength of the Lord" and the "strength of His might?"

Challenge:

Take time to meditate on these few verses and discover what God is calling you to.

Thursday

Subject: Put on the Armor

Scripture: Ephesians 6:13-16

Commentary:

In these verses, Paul describes four of the six pieces of the spiritual armor with which God equips His children to resist and overcome Satan's assaults. He emphasizes the necessity for the Christian to appropriate God's full spiritual armor by taking it up, or in other words, putting it on. The belt that pulls all the spiritual loose ends in is "truth" or "truthfulness". A sincere commitment to fight and win without hypocrisy. The breastplate of righteousness (holiness) is given to the believer as he/she is continually sanctified in the alien righteousness of God the Son and thus produces a daily righteousness not of our doing but of the author of righteousness himself, Jesus Christ. The shoes of peace bring the good news that, through Christ, believers are at peace with God and He is on their side. The shield of faith is continual trust in God and His word in protection from temptations to every sort of sin. Temptation (flaming darts) may come, but the power it has over you and I is broken. Put on the armor... now secure the armor.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How have I "put on" the armor of God?
- 2. How has this been a comfort to me as I engage in the daily spiritual battle that ensues?

Challenge:

Put on and appropriate the armor of God in order to stand against the schemes of the enemy.

Friday

Subject: Secure the Armor

Scripture: Ephesians 6:17-20

Commentary:

The helmet was a major protective means in battle as it protected the head which contains the mind. Satan seeks to destroy the believer's assurance of salvation with his weapons of doubt and discouragement. But although a Christian's feelings about salvation may be seriously damaged by Satan-inspired doubt, his/her salvation is secure in the One who saved them to begin with. The One who saves us is the One who keeps us saved. What a relief!!! Security is a fact; assurance is a feeling that comes to the obedient Christian. The sword of the Spirit is indicative of the soldier's only offensive weapon; so God's word is the only offensive weapon needed for the believer. God's word is "active and sharper than any two edged sword" (Heb. 4:12). It is infinitely more powerful to combat any of Satan's attempts at victory. It is the truth of Scripture which gives us our foundation in which to build our hope. It is truly an offensive weapon indeed. Have you secured the armor in the partaking of the truth of God's word?

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How do I plan to get into God's word more regularly as to stand against the schemes of the devil?
- 2. What is the plan or strategy I might use to accomplish this?

Challenge:

Find a Bible study plan that will work for you and stick to it. There are many to choose from and there is one that is right for you!
