Subject: Your Friends Say Much Scripture: Proverbs 13:20

Commentary:

What a simple rule for wisdom and life! Get rid of foolish friends, and choose the wise for friends. You will grow in wisdom and avoid much trouble in life. Good athletes use superior competition to bring out their best, even if it means frequent training losses.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you choose friends wisely?
- 2. Do you have friends you need to reconsider?

Tuesday

Subject: Friends with God. Scripture: Romans 5:1–2

Commentary:

Barnes' Notes on Romans 5:2

We have access – See the note at John 14:6, "I am the way," etc. Doddridge renders it, "by whom we have been introduced," etc. It means, "by whom we have the privilege of obtaining the favor of God which we enjoy when we are justified." The word rendered "access" occurs but in two other places in the New Testament, Ephesians 2:18; Ephesians 3:12. By Jesus Christ the way is opened for us to obtain the favor of God.

Questions for further thought:

1. Do you really believe you have access?

2. Who introduced you to God?

Challenge: Introduce Someone to God!

Wednesday

Subject: Scripture: Conflict amongst friends Philemon 1:8–9

Commentary:

The biblical story of Philemon and Onesimus tells its current hearers that our common status in Christ is more than simply a spiritual or eschatological reality. When Paul writes that there is neither a slave nor a master class in Christ, since all are equal he is articulating a principle that is sociological as well as Christological (compare Galatians 3:28; Ephesians 2:11–22).

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you Believe we are all equal
- 2. When challenged with friendships do we seek to the word?

Challenge:

See what the Word says about conflict with friends.

Thursday

Subject: Scripture:

Walking in step Psalms 1:1-2

Commentary:

Here the gracious man is described both negatively (verse 1) and positively (verse 2). He is a man *who does not walk in the counsel of the ungodly.* He takes wiser counsel, and walks in the commandments of the Lord his God. To him the ways of piety are paths of peace and pleasantness. His footsteps are ordered by the Word of God, and not by the cunning and wicked devices of carnal men. It is a rich sign of inward grace when the outward walk is changed. Charles H. Spurgeon

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you walk in the counsel of the ungodly?
- 2. Whose footsteps are you following?

Challenge:

Where can you change your walk?

Subject: Jealousy Scripture: Genesis: 26:12–17

Commentary:

God blessed Isaac. Be it observed, for the encouragement of poor tenants who occupy other people's lands, and are honest and industrious, that God blessed him with a great increase. The Philistines envied Isaac. It is an instance of the vanity of the world; for the more men have of it, the more they are envied, and exposed to censure and injury. Also of the corruption of nature; for that is an ill principle indeed, which makes men grieve at the good of others. They made Isaac go out of their country. That wisdom which is from above, will teach us to give up our right, and to draw back from contentions. If we are wrongfully driven from one place, the Lord will make room for us in another. Matthew Henry Commentary.

- 2. Who amongst us are you envious?
