Hebrews 13:7 (NLT) Remember your leaders who taught you the word of God. Think of all the good that has come from their lives, and follow the example of their faith.

Monday

Subject: One Friend Away

Scripture: Proverbs 13:20, 19:20, 27:17;

1 Samuel 23:15-16

Commentary:

Having the right friend can lead you to be wiser and closer to God. A good, Godly friend will challenge you to become a better person by being honest, truthful, and hold you accountable for your actions. Do an inventory of your friends to determine if you have at least one of these types of friends. As you seek people's friendship keep this in mind; do not just have friends by default.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How have you gained the friends that you have?
- 2. Are your closest friends the "best" friends for you?

Challenge:

Inventory your friends and journal how each person influences you – good or bad.

Tuesday

Subject: Is Jesus your friend?

Scripture: John 15:12-15; James 4:8

Commentary:

Jesus is the best friend and influence that you could have. Do your actions show that He is your friend? As Jesus stated in John, "you are my friends IF you do what I command you". In order to consider Jesus your friend you need to be studying and knowing how He acted, spoke, and what he commanded. His entire focus was to do the will of the Father and love Him with his whole heart, mind, and soul.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you consider Jesus your friend?
- 2. Do you follow his example?

Challenge:

Reflect on your day. Are there things that you should have done differently in order to reflect your friendship with Jesus to others?

Wednesday

Subject: Good or Bad

Scripture: Matthew 7:17-20

Commentary:

This passage tells us that evaluating your friends should be quite easy... v18 "A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and a bad tree cannot bear good fruit." What kind of fruit are your friends producing, or differently asked, what type of fruit are your friends holding you accountable to produce? This is very important since it is determining your future....v19 "Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." This is a very serious prediction.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What type of fruit are your friends producing?
- 2. What type of fruit are you producing?

Challenge:

Read verse 19 and ponder on it. Is this the future that you are planning for or planning against?

Thursday

Subject: Break up with Bad Influences

Scripture: I Corinthians 5:11, 15:33;

Proverbs 14:6-7

Commentary:

After doing an inventory on your friends were there any that you determined were not the best influence? If yes, Proverbs says to "leave the presence of a fool". Corinthians says if this person "claims to be a believer to not associate with them; do not even eat with them". You must find a way to "break up" with them and remove them from your influence circle.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Where are your friends leading you?
- 2. Do you have any friends that you need to break up with?

Challenge:

Resolve to remove yourself from the influence of this friend. Prepare yourself by devising a plan or an out. For example: if this person is a gossiper at work, plan a way to step out of the conversation such as needing to warm up your coffee.

Friday

Subject: Find a friend

Scripture: Galatians 5:16-18

Commentary:

Keep your whole heart, mind, and soul focused on God and follow His Spirit and you will not want or be able to be influenced by bad fruit. Following God's Spirit will lead you to that positive one friend that will help you to become wiser and closer to God.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Is God leading you to reach out to a new friend?
- 2. Where is the Spirit leading you?

Challenge:

Take time this week to meditate.
