Title: Ask Like Gideon Scripture: Judges 6:13–14

This week's memory verse

John 8:32 (NLT) And you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.

Monday

Subject: Why do the wicked prosper? Scripture: Job 21:7-15, 40:1-14

Commentary:

Job has lost his children, his wealth, his reputation and his health. In his pain, he compares his situation to those around him who defy God and yet seem happy and successful. It isn't fair. Isn't God supposed to vindicate the innocent and crush the wicked? He doesn't seem to be doing his job. Then God replies. He sounds a little sarcastic, but the message is clear. Job is unable to understand, because he is just a man. But God is divine, and has all things in control. Job can trust Him completely.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you been in a situation where God didn't do what you expected of Him? Explain.
- 2. God responded to Job, but he didn't really answer all his questions. Why do you suppose that was?

Challenge:

Consider a time you thought you knew how to handle things better than God. Prayerfully confess your thoughts and ask God to help you trust that He is good, even in difficult times.

Tuesday

Subject: Can I mess up God's plans? Scripture: Jonah 4:1–11

Commentary:

Jonah is a prophet for God, but he spends most of his time complaining, or feeling sorry for himself. He has chosen to ignore God's direction in his life, and things aren't going well for him. God, on the other hand, is persistent and forgiving with everyone, orchestrating opportunities for people to learn and repent of their sins. By the end of the book, pretty much everyone mentioned is turning towards God (except Jonah). But even the reluctant prophet ended up doing what God asked of him. If God wants something done, he can make it happen!

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Why do you think Jonah didn't want God to spare Nineveh?
- 2. If God is in charge of the results, how does that affect your thinking about something He may be asking you to do?

Challenge:

Pause and consider if you have been putting off, avoiding, or otherwise running away from something God is asking you to do. Pray for the strength and clarity of purpose to take a step in that direction.

Wednesday

Subject: Scripture: Please don't let this child die 2 Samuel 12:13–25

Commentary:

David has repented of his sin, but there are still consequences for his actions. We see him pleading for the life of his son, even though God has declared that he would not live. He knows God is merciful and fully in control of the situation. When the child dies, he gets up and goes to worship God. Not because he is happy, but because he is working to accept God's will in his life. David once again is putting God in His rightful place.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What is the difference between being forgiven for a sin, and the consequence of sin?
- 2. Have you been in a place where God has said no to your prayers? How did you respond?

Challenge:

Can you think of someone who could use comfort or encouragement? Make time to contact them or spend time with them in some way today.

Thursday

Subject: Is doubt okay? Scripture: John 20:24–29

Commentary:

"I can't believe this unless I experience it myself." This is a natural reaction when someone shares an incredible experience. Thomas had seen Jesus die. He couldn't believe Jesus was alive again on someone's word alone. Jesus generously gave Thomas exactly the experience he asked for. Thomas, for his part, embraced the experience and believed. While we rarely get all the answers we want, the Truth can withstand questions and doubt as we seek to understand and believe.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you have specific doubts about God or Jesus that you are struggling with today?
- 2. Do you think God will provide enough information and experiences to allow us to embrace and believe in Him, as he did for Thomas?

Challenge:

God knows your doubts and fears. Confess them to Him. Pray for peace and understanding as you wrestle with these questions.

Friday

Subject: Just ask Scripture: Matthew 11:2-6

Commentary:

John the Baptist didn't beat around the bush when he had questions. He was already in jail after calling people to repentance, and declaring that the Messiah was coming. Now he wanted to make sure Jesus was the right guy. Here is a man with a strong and active faith, and he is still asking questions and checking to make sure he is in line with God's plan.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Why might John have been confused about whether Jesus was the true Messiah?
- 2. Do you have questions that you have been afraid to ask?

Challenge:

How would your life change if you found answers to your forbidden questions? Take some time today to explore your thoughts and fears around these questions.
