November Mission Focus - Safe Families

Safe Families is a bridge between under-resourced families and the foster care system. A Safe Family would take in children to allow a mom or dad time to locate work, locate housing, complete treatment, etc. without the child having to move into the foster care system.

During the month of November, Hillcrest will be collecting diapers, wipes, and WalMart gift cards for Safe Families. (Reminder that you can order WalMart cards from SCRIP! We will have some available to pick up at the Welcome Center, too!)

Monday

Subject: Seek God

Scripture: Hebrews 11:6

Commentary:

God wants us to seek Him in every aspect of life. He created this world so that we could understand His mighty and awesome power. He gave us science so we could study His creation. He gave us relationships so that we can better understand His love. God gave us a mind so that we can pursue Him. We need to use these gifts to seek Him in everything.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How can you seek Him?
- 2. Why does God want us to seek Him?

Challenge:

Find something that interests you and see how you can use this interest to build your faith in Christ.

Tuesday

Subject: Is it ok to question God?

Scripture: Job 7:20-21

Commentary:

God wants us to trust in Him. He is the Father of all and if we cannot question Him who could we ask for answers? God knows our anguish and our pleasure; He knows everything about us because He made us. He wants us to lay our troubles on Him and He will comfort us.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you ever questioned God and then He responded in a way you did not expect?
- 2. Does questioning God mean lack of faith?

Challenge:

This week speak with God in a place of solitude and then wait in silence for an answer.

Wednesday

Subject: What does God require of us?

Scripture: Deuteronomy 10:12-13

Commentary:

The passage gives us an answer to what God wants from us. What if we do not meet all these requirements? Is God going to abandon us? He knows we cannot meet these requirements entirely but He is asking us to do the best we can. He is more concerned with where are heart is at then He is with our mess ups.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Would God ever not accept our prayers for forgiveness?
- 2. What is one way you can improve your heart for God?

Challenge:

Think of a sin that is causing a barrier between you and God. Ask a close friend to pray with you for this weakness.

Thursday

Subject: Friends

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

Commentary:

God intended for us to do life together. Friendship is one of many gifts He has blessed us with. We all have times where we need a close friend for comfort, wisdom, guidance and love. We all need someone we can trust and someone needs each one of us for friendship.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you have a close friend that you can share your life with?
- 2. What is holding you back from committing to a friend?

Challenge:

Pray that God will bring you a close friend that will walk through life with you.

Friday

Subject: Serving

Scripture: Galatians 5:13

Commentary:

Jesus served us by coming to this earth to die on the cross for our sins. He was our perfect example on how to do life. God wants us to serve others because it is an act of love. It also teaches compassion for others.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How does the act of serving others make you feel?
- 2. What do the un-churched think when we serve Christians and non-Christians?

Challenge:

Serve a Christian and non-Christian person this week.
