

Monday

Subject: Earning God's Favor

Scripture: Galatians 5:1-2

Commentary:

Most of us have heard the phrase "freedom in Christ," yet few of us truly experience it for very long after our salvation. We put ourselves right back into slavery, by believing we need to do more to stay in God's favor and keep Him loving us. The people of Galatia were also being taught by false teachings that they must do more also.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What is meant by "slavery to the law" or "yoke of slavery?"
- 2. Do you ever feel like God loves some of His children more than He loves you? Who? Why?

Challenge:

Spend some quiet time with God this week and ask Him to show you where you might be trying to earn His favor or His love.

Tuesday

Subject: God's Agape Love

Scripture: Romans 6:23; Ephesians 2:8-9

Commentary:

God the Father sent His Son, Jesus, to pay for our sins because He knew we could not stop sinning – that's how much He loves us! He knew that in order to have a relationship with us and for us to understand how much He loves us; our sins had to be atoned for once and for always.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How do you think God feels when you mess up? Does He love you less?
- 2. In light of Christ's sacrifice, how do you think it makes God feel when you do things to please Him because you are afraid He won't love you?

Challenge:

Imagine what God is thinking, as a loving parent, when you "mess up." Imagine a loving response to Him watching you make mistakes.

Wednesday

Subject: Fallen From Grace

Scripture: Galatians 5:3-4; James 2:10-11

Commentary:

The Galatians had been told a lie: they had to be circumcised to truly please God. This wasn't even in keeping with Old Testament law because to truly please God you had to keep ALL of the laws. It was not enough to keep just one. In believing the lie, they had fallen from grace.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What does it mean to "fall from grace?"
- 2. Does it make sense to accept God's gift of grace through Christ's sacrifice and still try to earn favor by obeying the rules/laws? Why or why not?

Challenge:

Set aside several times today to tell yourself, "God loves me just the way I am. I can do nothing to change that or make Him love me any more or any less."

Thursday

Subject: Stay the Course to Freedom

Scripture: Galatians 5:7-11

Commentary:

Paul refers several times to the Christian life as running a race. He is disappointed to see the Galatians influenced and detoured by others to go off the path. They believed something other than the truth preached to them before, which was the freedom they had by faith in Christ alone.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What lies have you been told that lead you to believe you have to do something other than have faith in Christ's salvation through the cross to stay in God's favor?
- 2. How has that impacted your relationship with God?

Challenge:

Write down at least one wrong message you are listening to (or have listened to) and make a commitment to let it go or change your way of thinking about it.

Friday

Subject: Obedience and Motivation

Scripture: Galatians 5:6 & 14, John 14:15 & 21

Commentary:

God gives us a commandment – to love others. This is not to gain His favor though. We can do nothing to earn His love or His favor; nor can we do anything to have it taken away.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What is the motivation God wants us to have in keeping His commandments?
- 2. How is obedience out of love different from obedience out of fear?

Challenge:

Why do you do the things we are told in scripture to do? (i.e. Go to church, be kind to others, baptism, honor your parents, tithe, or _____ (fill in the blank))? Ask God to help you understand His agape love for you so you are obeying His commands out of love and gratitude towards His rich mercy.
