

This week's memory verse

John 8:12 (NLT) Jesus spoke to the people once more and said, "I am the light of the world. If you follow me, you won't have to walk in darkness, because you will have the light that leads to life."

Monday

Subject: Woe to the Rich

Scripture: Luke 6:20-25

Commentary:

In delivering the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus turned the worldview of finances upside down. Imagine—the poor and destitute will one day be elevated, the rich and affluent will be humbled. What Jesus did not explain is that these events would not come to pass due to a military revolution or by force, but by believer's selfless acts of giving and sharing. The early church served as an example of this type of giving, but the modern world seems to have forgotten this important lesson.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you following Jesus' teaching of selfless giving?
- 2. Do you have more of a "world view" regarding helping others?

Challenge:

It is easy to look the other way, especially if we believe that someone is going without because of choices they have made. That is not the attitude Jesus desires of us. We don't necessarily need to enable laziness or dishonesty or foolishness, but we are expected to step up and alleviate suffering where we can.

Tuesday

Subject: The Problem and the Solution

Scripture: Acts 2:44-45

Commentary:

The problem with wealth in Jesus' day is that it was for the most part controlled by Herod and the Romans. Ordinary people who had worked hard and acquired some land or possessions were often forced to hand it over to the Roman Empire, finding themselves penniless. Jobs other than those controlled by the Roman government were almost non- existent. The early church took action in an attempt to deal with the problem of poverty and economic insecurity. The believers gave to and shared with one another sacrificially to combat the horrible injustice and poverty caused by the Roman occupation. The church community was a place of safety and encouragement and help. Unfortunately in the present age, we have become too isolated and self-sufficient. We are not relying on God or each other as they did in Jesus' day.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Can you identify a community or group that you are a part of?
- 2. If not, why?

Challenge:

Hillcrest desires to be your community of hope, encouragement and help. Get involved in a small group and let people show you the love of Christ.

Wednesday

Subject: The Rich Young Ruler

Scripture: Luke 18: 22-23

Commentary:

About the only way one became rich during the Roman occupation was to be in collusion with Herod and the Roman regime. This young man was very likely being less than truthful when he told Jesus that he had been obeying the commandments since he was a boy. He was probably in possession of "unrighteous wealth"—that gained by the dishonest treatment of others. Jesus asked him to give up this wealth and give up the manner in which he gained it in order to gain a far greater reward. We know from scripture how the young man responded.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you honest in your treatment of others or are you in possession of "unrighteous wealth"?
- 2. How will you change your methods in light of today's story?

Challenge:

Have you ever celebrated when someone gave you too much change for a purchase you made and said nothing? Have you taken liberties on your tax return and gotten away with it? These are examples of "unrighteous wealth". Be on guard and be honest in your dealings with others.

Thursday

Subject: Watch Out!

Scripture: Luke 12:13-21, 32-34

Commentary:

Jesus understands the human heart. We always focus on what is most important to us. If our main focus is our pride, our ego, our bank account or our investments, then our focus will be on how to keep these things and make more. As we spend more and more time and effort to gain more and more material "things" we have less and less time and energy to pursue the "things" that please God—helping one another, meeting together, encouraging one another and loving and caring for our community.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you feeling burned out chasing "The American Dream"?
- 2. Are you finding time to meet with your community and to care for others?

Challenge:

Working towards and saving for a "rainy day" or retirement is wise, but if you are doing so at the expense of serving and blessing others, then your reward will very likely be left here on earth when you enter eternity.

Friday

Subject: Seek the Kingdom

Scripture: Mathew 6: 25, 31–34

Commentary:

To the majority of Jesus' listeners, this teaching was totally upside down to what they were experiencing. What? Not worry about food or clothes or where you were sleeping? Really? These were everyday concerns. Many days starvation was only hours away. How could you NOT worry when you didn't necessarily know where your next meal would come from and your kids were hungry? Jesus knows that worry and desperation often prevents us from coming to God in prayer, asking for His provision, trusting that He knows what we need and has the ability to care for us and that He knows what is best for us. Jesus tells us that we should be going to God FIRST, not after we have exhausted all other avenues to sustain ourselves, which is foolishness.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you worry about the future?
- 2. Do you take those concerns to God in prayer?

Challenge:

Planning and preparing for the future is a good idea, but worrying about the future is a waste of time. Take your concerns to God and He will provide answers.
