#### 1st Sunday at the Pizza Ranch

Today is the first Sunday of the month. You are all invited to lunch at the 41<sup>st</sup> Street Pizza Ranch following the 10:30 service. This is an informal event, so simply show up and enjoy lunch with other Hillcresters. There is no need to RSVP and each person/family will be responsible for the cost of their own meals.

#### Hillcrest Camping Trip

This year, our annual camping trip at Newton Hills State Park will be held June 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup>, the weekend after VBS. On Saturday evening, June 6<sup>th</sup>, we will also have a picnic for everyone, even if you are not camping. This is an annual tradition at Hillcrest and we encourage everyone to join in whatever way they can. In order to secure enough spots, we will need to make reservations for camping sites and cabins on March 6<sup>th</sup>, so please sign up for camping and have your payment in no later than Sunday, March 1st.

- Electrical Site \$19 a night- \$38 for weekend
- Tent site \$15 a night- \$30 for weekend

Spots (especially cabins) are limited. You may register for Friday night, only, or for Friday and Saturday night. Checks and credit cards will be accepted at the Welcome Center or you can pay on-line by clicking on the "Give Online" button on our home page, and choosing "Events." If you would like to use SCRIP, please contact either Brian or Jennifer. There will be no refunds, unless we are unable to secure your spot. Reminder that if you do not have a yearly pass, the state park entrance fee of \$6 per day (per vehicle) will also be required at the time of arrival.

This week's memory verse

John 5:36 (NLT) But I have a greater witness than John—my teachings and my miracles. The Father gave me these works to accomplish, and they prove that he sent me.

## Monday

Subject: Scripture: God is Faithful Psalm 145:8–18

### Commentary:

God has not called us to blindly have faith in Him. His character is revealed throughout history and the scriptures. Here, David praises God for His strength as creator and provider. He certainly fills the role of God in that category. Second, is a softer, but perhaps more profound side to God. This passage is full of His grace, love, and faithfulness towards his creation. Together we begin to glimpse the character of God. A God who can be relied upon in any situation.

## Questions for further thought:

- 1. If you are able to rely on a God who "...is faithful to all His promises and loving toward all he has made." How does that affect your daily struggles?
- 2. The passage repeatedly talks of God loving all his creation, not just the "good" people. What do you think of God being so inclusive with His love?

## Challenge:

Take notes throughout the day today, documenting the ways, big and small, that God is faithfully providing for you.

## Tuesday

Subject: Giving in to Pressure Scripture: Judges 16:6-21

### Commentary:

Samson was a man who was dedicated to God from birth. He was the leader of Israel. However, through many small choices he drifted from God's will. When he finally gave in to Delilah's constant questioning of his love for her it was another small decision. He didn't expect God to really leave him weak and vulnerable. He may not have even realized how much he had begun to rely on himself rather than God. Somewhere in the process, he gave up on his faith. Samson suffered greatly from his choices, but God used his situation to turn Samson's direction around.

## Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you ever found yourself on a destructive path, without even quite realizing how you got there? Explain.
- 2. Were you able to change your course? In what way did it happen? Or what hasn't worked?

## Challenge:

Take time to meet with a friend, mentor, or accountability partner to discuss anything that might currently be pulling you away from God.

Wednesday

Subject: Run with Purpose Scripture: 1 Corinthians 9:24–27

#### Commentary:

Life is hard. It is hard when you lose a job, a loved one, or an opportunity. Then it is hard when you find yourself slogging through the mundane, day after day with no end in sight. But this passage reminds us that we aren't laboring in vain. God gives us the strength and grace we need, not just to reach the finish line, but to run the race well.

### Questions for further thought:

- 1. Sometimes your situation can leave you feeling lost or aimless. What kind of training might help you through such times?
- 2. How do you balance self-effort with reliance on God?

### Challenge:

Take the thing you are most worried about and try to put it in God's hands for the day. In exchange, ask for something positive to focus on.

## Thursday

Subject: In Trouble Again Scripture: Genesis 39:7–21

#### Commentary:

In this passage, we see that Joseph has unintentionally gained the attention of his master's wife. He has a choice to make. The choice may not be easy in the moment, but the right choice is at least clear. However, even though he refuses her advances, he still ends up in trouble. Yet God stays with Joseph, and he is entrusted to do greater things for God down the road.

## Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you ever felt like you were in trouble for making the right choice? What happened?
- 2. Did you see benefits in the long run in spite of any initial consequences?

## Challenge:

Take time to journal about any insights you discovered from making a hard choice regardless of the outcome.

Friday

Subject: The Example of Jesus Scripture: Luke 4:1–13

#### Commentary:

"You are hungry. Change this rock into bread so you can eat." "Just worship me, and I will give you everything you desire." "If you are who you say you are - jump - you will be protected." Jesus was tempted in many ways. In these examples, we see a potent way to overcome temptation when it comes. Jesus knows His Father in heaven, He knows His place in God's plan, and he knows Scripture well enough to reinforce His knowledge and relationship with His Father. This allows Him to recognize that He doesn't need to test God's faithfulness or provision. He lacks nothing that He needs to do God's will.

## Questions for further thought:

- 1. Can you think of a time you have been tempted to do the wrong thing? What was your motivation?
- 2. Do you feel like God has provided all you need for what He is asking in your life? Why or why not?

## Challenge:

Temptations are tempting. Set aside some time today to pray for strength in your times of weakness, and find a few key verses to remind you of God's faithfulness.
