

Title: You Are Not in Control

Scripture: Isaiah 55:8; Proverbs 19:21; John 8:34;

1 John 1:9; Romans 6:18; John 8:36

For those going deeper:

This week's memory verse

Romans 6:12 (NLT) Do not let sin control the way you live; do not give in to sinful desires.

Monday

Subject: Ananias and Sapphira

Scripture: Acts 5:1-10

Commentary:

Ananias and Sapphira's was not that they kept back part of the money for themselves but that they made it appear that they gave all of the money. Their desire to be praised by others for their supposed generosity would be their downfall.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What tasks might you be doing in the name of God but in your heart, you are seeking the praise of others?
- 2. Assuming these are tasks God truly wants you to be doing, how can you change your intention or direct the reason back to serving God and others?

Challenge:

Make a change in your intention (e.g. make it more God-centered) towards one of the tasks God has set out for you to do.

Tuesday

Subject: Gifts to the Needed

Scripture: Matthew 6:1-4; Luke 21:1-4

Commentary:

In the 1st passage, Jesus calls out the individuals who make a big show of giving to the needy in the synagogues as hypocrites. They aren't giving out of love but for show. In the 2nd passage, Jesus sees a widow drop in two coins at the temple. She doesn't make a big show out of dropping the two coins and Jesus points us to her as an example of true giving.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What gifts to God or others might you have given in the past more for show (if any)?
- 2. What can you do to prevent yourself from doing this in the future?

Challenge:

Ask God to give you an opportunity to give with the right heart and intentions in place with no anticipation of any glory or praise from others.

Wednesday

Subject: The Wife of Noble Character

Scripture: Proverbs 31:10-31

Commentary:

Although this passage describes a woman of noble character, I believe this is meant as a great example for men and women to follow. We should all fear the Lord and put others before our own needs.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How do you identify or not identify with the wife of noble character?
- 2. What might you want to change about your actions/behavior as a result of reading this example?

Challenge:

Pray about the change you want to make and ask God for guidance and steps for making the change.

Thursday

Subject: The Pharaoh

Scripture: Exodus 12:29-39

Commentary:

Throughout the story of Moses in the book of Exodus, the Pharaoh believes himself to be in control—what he says goes. However, God really was and still is. God knew the choices Pharaoh would make and used them to further His plan for the Israelites.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What situations or things do you believe you control?
- 2. What makes you think you have control over these?

Challenge:

Pray and consider how God may actually have control over these situations in your life and what His plan might be in giving you these things.

Friday

Subject: Even Jesus

Scripture: Matthew 26: 36-42

Commentary:

Even Jesus realized who was in control. Just like we do, He asked the Father to change His circumstances. So, we aren't wrong in asking God for things or to change our situations. We are wrong when we forget who is in control and take things into our own hands.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What situations/things do you need to turn over to God?
- 2. What is an outcome of taking things into our own hands?

Challenge:

Ask God to show you situations where you aren't waiting or letting Him take control.
