Title: Our Need to be Blessed

Scripture: Matthew 3:17; Jeremiah 29:11; Ephesians 3:1;

Genesis 12:1-20

Psalm 5:12 (NLT) For you bless the godly, O Lord; you surround them with your shield of love.

Monday

Subject: Blessing from a father

Scripture: Matthew 3:17

Commentary:

John the Baptist was baptizing people with water, for those repentant from sin. The intent was to make a public confession and have your sins washed away. Jesus—the perfect sinless human, allowed himself to be baptized by John the Baptist. He had no sins to confess or to be washed away yet he was baptized. He gave us a model to follow—confession, repentance, baptism, and follow Jesus as a disciple. What was God's reaction to this act? He declared from the Heavens "this is my son whom I love, with Him I am well pleased." This was a powerful statement for Jesus to hear publically that his father loved him and was pleased with his action. Imagine the impact it also had on all those who were present as witnesses.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Who have you longed to hear a blessing, words of encouragement or affirmation?
- 2. Is there someone who needs to hear the same from you?

Challenge:

The reality is you may not be able to change your answer to the first question but you can to the second. Begin praying today for the opportunity to bless the person in question two.

Tuesday

Subject: God has the last word

Scripture: Jeremiah 29:11

Commentary:

The Israelites had been disobedient for many years, choosing to worship other gods in place of the One True God. There are consequences for these actions – they would be in captivity in Babylon for seventy years. The people of Israel were being told likes from false prophets. God communicated his message to them through the prophet Jeremiah—who carried God's message—a blessing.

God had plans for His people- plan for them to prosper, not harm them, plans to give them hope and a future. As the people called to God, he would hear them and bring them back home and be their God. There is hope for us when we mess up, God wants us to call out to him, pray to him and he promises he will listen and be our God.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. When have you felt exiled or punished for things you've done?
- 2. How did you find your way back to God?

Challenge:

God has the last word. He wants us to receive His blessing. Sometime we get in the way of receiving His blessing. Call upon God, pray to Him, and He promises he will listen. (Jer 29:12-14)

Wednesday

Subject: Blessed to be a blessing

Scripture: Genesis 12:1-3

Commentary:

We have a worship song that says "I have been blessed, now I want to be a blessing." God called Abram (later changed to Abraham). That worship song is Abraham's story. God spoke to him and told him to leave his country, and people, to leave everything and go to the land God would show him. God promised he would make him into a great nation (land and property) and God would bless him, make his name great, and he would be a blessing to others, that all people on earth would be blessed through him. What a huge request with so many unknowns and so many possibilities.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Would you have been willing to do what God asked Abraham to do?
- 2. How do you respond to requests when you don't have all the answers?

Challenge:

Imagine you were Abraham. Now think about what things God has been asking you to do? What is holding you back?

Thursday

Subject: God of everyone

Scripture: Ephesians 3:1, Acts 9:15-16

Commentary:

Israelites were God's chosen people. He chose them to have a close and personal relationship with him. He would be their God, and they would be His people. That relationship was to be an example to the rest of the world-to be a blessing to all nations so God would their God-the God for everyone.

Paul was a devout Jew, who believed God was the God of the Jews only. He was a persecutor of Christ's followers until he met Jesus on the road to Damascas. Jesus declared that Paul was His chosen instrument to carry His name to gentiles (people who weren't Jews). So Paul was to declare that God was the God for everyone, and His son Jesus was the savior/messiah for everyone.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you ever have difficulty seeing Jesus as the savior for everyone? Explain.
- 2. Are there people you have written off? People who you don't think would ever accept hearing about a savior?

Challenge:

We can become so "devout" to our beliefs that we can be very narrow in who Jesus loves and died for. Do you need to be praying for someone specific?

Friday

Subject: Is your light shining

Scripture: Matthew 5:16

Commentary:

Hillcrest is a church on a hill; we are to be a light to the world. We are to be a beacon of light to for others to see- providing light in a world of darkness. As people of Hillcrest, followers of Christ, we are to provide light to a dark world. We are to behave in such a way that others will see the good we do and praise our Father in heaven. Our actions should draw others to God. Our behavior should cause others to ask questions which lead them to discover the God we serve and His son our savior Jesus.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do your actions cause people to ask questions, such as why do you do the things you do?
- 2. Who needs you to be the light of Christ to them?

Challenge:

If being a Christ follower was a crime- would your life provide enough evidence to convict you? If your answer was no, what changes do you need to make today?
