# Monday

Subject: Give Me Shelter Scripture: Psalm 91:1-2

## Commentary:

All of us want to feel safe, to have a sense of security. That is a basic human need. The question becomes, how do we fulfill that need? What do we rely on to feel safe? That can depend on our circumstances. Answers may vary from money to a state-of-the-art security system to a place to sleep tonight. For the psalmist, however, there is only one answer. God is the only trustworthy source of safety and security.

# Questions for further thought:

- 1. When you feel insecure and afraid, what or who do you turn to first for comfort?
- 2. What would trusting in God as your true source of security look like for you, practically speaking?

## Challenge:

Dwelling in God's shelter means living each moment knowing that He is where you feel safe: in the palm of His hand, under His wings, in His fortress. When feelings of apprehension and insecurity mount, picture yourself in a place where you see God holding you, covering you, or sheltering you. Can you see it? Feel it? Stay in that moment until you do.

# Tuesday

# Subject: An Unbreakable Bond Scripture: Romans 8:35–38

## Commentary:

Our sense of safety is derived, to some degree, from the level to which we can trust the key people in our life. It is hard to experience stability if those you care about most walk out on you. Human relationships can be fragile, as can the security they provide. God's love is different. No imaginable circumstances can separate us from His love and care through Christ.

## Questions for further thought:

- 1. Think of a time in your life when someone you counted on left you hanging. How did that affect your ability to trust others?
- 2. Are there times when you find it difficult to truly believe that God loves and cares for you? Describe those times.

## Challenge:

During blinding snowstorms, farmers would tie a rope from their house to the barn in order to reach it safely. That tether was the difference between returning home to their family and mindless wandering that often resulted in death. When you begin to feel yourself wandering and far from God and His choices for your life, grab hold of that rope that connects you to Him and His plan for you. Find a scripture that provides you with this security and memorize it for times when you feel lost and alone.

Wednesday

Subject: Scripture: Fighting the 'If Onlys' Philippians 4:11–13

### Commentary:

We are immersed in an economy that is driven by discontent. If only you have this car, this device, this home, this body, this career – then, at last, you will have arrived. Unfortunately, in a culture of comparison, we can always find someone who has a little bit more. Discontent breeds insecurity and feelings of failure. Paul found the antidote in the realization that circumstances don't create contentment. That can only come from God who gives us the strength to live secure in Him

## Questions for further thought:

- 1. Think of a commercial you've seen recently that really made you want to buy/do/achieve the thing being advertised. What was it that appealed to you?
- 2. If you could identify the biggest area of discontent in your life, what would it be? Is it legitimate?

# Challenge:

When you are at a social function, often one of the first questions you might be asked by a stranger is "What do you do?" or "Who do you work for?" What if we responded with the work or job that Christ has given for us to do and that we work for Jesus? Can you imagine the reactions you would receive? How much more content you would feel in this world knowing this is not your home? Try it!

Thursday

Subject: Focus, Focus, Focus Scripture: Hebrews 12:1-3

## Commentary:

Even when we know that our safety and security lie in God alone, it can be hard to remember that fact. Life is hard, and full of hurdles that require our attention. It can be difficult to keep the ultimate goal of our life in mind. The author of Hebrews rightly compares our life to a race and stresses that best way to run is to keep our eyes fixed on the source of our security, our prime example, and the reason we run – Jesus. When we lose that focus, the cares of life can overwhelm us.

## Questions for further thought:

- 1. As you run your race of life, what most often distracts you from focusing on Christ?
- 2. Have you found ways to keep you focused on the prize? How can you put these into practice more regularly?

## Challenge:

During childbirth, we women are asked to find a focal point and concentrate on it during our breathing and contractions. The labor is worth the ultimate reward. The focus helps us to get there. When you are faced with issues of the day that take your focus off of Christ, what focal point can bring you back to Him and what He desires for you? The cross around your neck? The picture of your family on your desk? The bible sitting by your bed? A memorized scripture? Find something that will refocus you on Christ and get you back in the race.

Friday

Subject:The Path to PeaceScripture:Philippians 4:6-9

## Commentary:

When we don't feel safe, we become anxious. We worry about what will happen next, often going over scenarios in our head that never come to pass. In the process, we waste precious chunks of our time on earth living in fear instead of by faith. In Philippians, Paul gives us a simple formula for security. Peace = prayer + practice. Instead of giving in to worry, ask the One who has charge of our entire life to take care of the concern. Take action, when necessary, by putting the truths we've learned in the Bible and from other mature Christians into practice. That's the best path to peace.

## Questions for further thought:

- Despite Paul's excellent advice and our best efforts to follow it, most of us find ourselves worrying from time to time. What circumstances in your life right now most need to move out of the worry category and into prayer?
- 2. It can be helpful to have a good friend who is well-grounded spiritually to pray with us and help us see how best to put our faith into practice. Do you have someone like this? Can you think of someone who could be this person for you?

# Challenge:

Anxiety is grounded in the unknown. Peace is grounded in truth. Write out, with pen and paper, what you know to be true. When anxiety and a restless heart and mind begin to take over your day, bring out the list. The list of truth- it may only be one sentence: God loves me. This statement is excellent and praiseworthy.
