Scripture: Matthew 8:3; Matthew 9:20-22

Monday

Subject: God's Side

Scripture: Romans 8:31-34

Commentary:

This has to be one of my favorite verses in the Bible. It gives me hope, it lifts me up, and most of all it gives me security. Just think about it, "If God is for us, who can be against us", Paul goes on to say, "Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us." God, who is the creator of the Universe, the All Powerful, always was and always is, is on my side. So much so that He sent his Son to die for me and to take my place so I may have eternal life. As Christians this gives us great hope and peace no matter what our situation. Whose side are you on?

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How does it make you feel to know as a Christian God is on your side?
- 2. What will you do this week to share the good news with others?

Challenge:

If you have not made a decision to follow Christ, make it the number one priority in your life.

Tuesday

Subject: Practice What You Preach

Scripture: Jeremiah 7:4-7

Commentary:

Who do we worship? Do we simply go to church and say we worship God? Do our actions really represent who we believe in? The prophet Jeremiah is relaying Gods words telling us that we are to practice what we preach. As true believers our actions and deeds truly reveal what we believe. We are to help the refugee, be a big brother or sister, take care of the widow, and not let our words cut each other down. Our actions towards others show that we are true believers and have faith in Christ Jesus.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do your daily interactions with others show you are a true believer?
- 2. Are you simply going through the motions as a believer? If so what will you do to change?

Challenge:

Take extra time this week to pray and seek how God would like you to "Practice What You Believe".

Wednesday

Subject: Don't be Complacent

Scripture: Amos 6:1-3

Commentary:

Are we complacent as Christians? Do we look at unbelievers and other Christians and say we are better than them. Do we listen to Christian music, read Christian books, and go to church every Sunday, and feel like we are good to go? Amos ruled at a time of great prosperity for Israel, and he was concerned that this prosperity was corrupting Israel. We are fortunate to live in a time and a country where we have great prosperity and are free to practice our faith. We need to make sure we do not take this for granted. We need to make sure we are keeping God at the center of all we do.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you take your faith for granted?
- 2. What are some ways you thank God for the great country and time we live in?

Challenge:

Make sure God is at the Center of your life, at work, home and church this week

Thursday

Subject: Don't be a Hypocrite

Scripture: Mathew 23:1–12

Commentary:

Jesus is telling us that we must be careful not to be Hypocrites. Our actions must support what we say. Are we serving at church just for the compliments, to make ourselves feel important, or are we serving because we feel it is where God wants us to be? We must be careful not to get the attitude that we are Christians so we are better than everyone else. Jesus came to earth and died so that we may receive the greatest gift of all, Salvation. We need to be careful to honor God in all we say and do. If we honor God in everything, it will keep us from being hypocrites.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you do things at work and home just to receive the praise, or because it is what God wants you to do?
- 2. Is God at the center of everything that you do?

Challenge:

If you have a prideful area in your life, give it up to God this week.

Friday

Subject: Give it to God

Scripture: Mathew 6:25-34

Commentary:

Sweet, all is good!!! Okay so that is easier to say than to believe. We are faced with many trials to this verse every day. We worry about paying the bills, about our jobs, about our families, about, about, about..... Jesus commands us to: "Seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness." We are to put God first and everything else is to come second. When we keep God first, the sinful part of our life that makes us worry does not go away, but we can plan ahead, get things done, and know that no matter what happens God is in control and will help us through. Hey, He Feeds the birds and clothes the flowers, just think what he will do for us!

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What are you worrying about this week?
- 2. What are you going to do to give you worries to God?

Challenge:

Share this week with someone how God has helped you through a difficult situation.
