Title: The Spies and the Prostitute Scripture: Joshua 2

For those going deeper:

This week's memory verse

Hebrews 12:2 (NLT) We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith. Because of the joy awaiting him, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame. Now he is seated in the place of honor beside God's throne.

Monday

Subject: Start Over Scripture: Joshua 2:1-7

Commentary:

Why would Rehab's house be the spot God chose for Joshua's spies to stay? Didn't he know who she was? What her reputation was?

Yes, of course he did. We are all given an opportunity (sometimes more than one) to align ourselves with God. God knew Rehab's heart was open to Him. She didn't allow her past to keep her from doing God's will and beginning a new life.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What is a way you have seen God trying to align our lives with Him?
- 2. Are there reasons or things about you that you find to keep from doing what God has called you to do? Try to see yourself as God sees you!

Challenge:

Pray for a way to have a new beginning in one or more areas of your life.

Tuesday

Subject: Overly Confident Scripture: Jeremiah 17:9; Proverbs 14:12

Commentary:

We all have experienced times of being over confident in ourselves, making decisions based on our own needs and wants. We have maybe even started endeavors with prayer, seeking God's will. Things fall into place. We begin to believe that our decisions are sound. We are Christians after all. We begin to believe since we are good people our intentions are good therefore we are capable of making good decisions. The problem is, is that leads to self-reliance. We grow farther away from being aligned with His will. We must remember who it is that is good. He makes us good. We must always seek His advisement!

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What are the ways you go about usually making decisions?
- 2. Is there a decision you are facing in your life that you can turn over to God so His will becomes your will?

Challenge:

Spend time this week in prayer on how you can hear God in your decision making processes.

Wednesday

Subject: Scripture: Renewing Our Minds Romans 12:2; Psalm 51:10

Commentary:

In order to align with God, we must know his will. Because of our sinful nature we constantly reject the will of God or we are unable to discern it. Psalms 51:10 is our prayer to God that he would clean us and make us new so that we can be loyal to his word. Paul in Romans tells us how we can help this process happen within us.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What are some ways you can tell God's will apart from your own?
- 2. What happened in times that you followed your own will instead of God's?

Challenge:

This week take a moment to read all of Romans Chapter 12.

Thursday

Subject: Scripture: J

Submission vs. Alignment Jeremiah 17:7; Proverbs 16:3

Commentary:

Are you attending church regularly? How often do you read your bible? How often do you sin? These are some of the questions people use to measure what "level" of a Christian you are. How many of these matter to God? None. But when we are aligned with God's will for our lives the spirit will put a wanting in our hearts to learn more about Him, to fellowship with other believers, to put effort into making righteous decisions. The numbers don't matter. Of course failure will come daily but our willingness to strive for bringing God glory in all we do should be how we measure ourselves.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. We all have areas in our lives that need work. What specific area is God calling you to strive to be more righteous?
- 2. What keeps you from believing that God can help you succeed in becoming more righteous?

Challenge:

Always the focus should be not on **what** you are doing, but on **why** you are doing it.

Friday

Subject: Seize the Opportunity!! Scripture: Hebrews 12:1; 1 Corinthians 16:9

Commentary:

Opportunity is a combination of circumstances favorable for a purpose. Why is it important that we as Christians then <u>seize</u> them? Which means, "strike fast, take possession of suddenly."

Notice how Paul says a wide door of opportunity has been opened unto him..... but with adversaries. The devil isn't going to sit down and play dead to let us seize our opportunities without a fight. Every opportunity that God gives us demands persevering, steadfast spirit.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Has there been an opportunity that you were slow to seize, and it came and went?
- 2. What is a way you can conquer your fear of failure in order to seize opportunity when it presents itself?

Challenge:

If you think an opportunity is impossible, remember that God would not have given you the ability beforehand to accomplish it.
