July Outreach Focus

<u>Urban Plunge:</u> Unfortunately, the Urban Plunge that was scheduled for July 17-19 had to be cancelled, because not enough people signed up for this local mission. We would like to know if this is something that people would be interested in taking part in at a different time of year or with more time to prepare. Please send all feedback to Pastor Brian.

Abbott House: Instead of the Urban Plunge, Hillcrest will be partnering with Life 96.5 to support their mission focus for July, which is the Abbott House in Mitchell, SD. Abbott House is a private charity that provides residential treatment services to girls between the age of 7 and 18, who have little or no family support and who have endured extreme trauma, experienced abuse, or who have be diagnosed with depression, anxiety, or ADHD. The agency provides not only intensive treatment but also foster care in a therapeutic home.

During the month of July, the radio station will be doing a drive for Abbott House and will provide drop-offs at each of their "sticker stops." They will take donations for new or gently used girl's and women's jeans, and large teddy bears. We will also collect these items here at Hillcrest and deliver them to the station.

Title: Double Agents

Scripture: Galatians 2:1-10

For those going deeper:

This week's memory verse

Isaiah 29:13 (NLT) And so the Lord says, "These people say they are mine. They honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. And their worship of me is nothing but man-made rules learned by rote.

Monday

Subject: That Isn't Normal

Scripture: Matthew 11:18–19

Commentary:

We are great at spotting differences in those around us. Anything that varies from our perception of normal makes us uncomfortable and suspicious. Neither John the Baptist nor Jesus fit into the "normal" Jewish culture of the day. However, Jesus points out that it is the substance of a life that matters, rather than the outward appearance.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What are a few ways other people might make you uncomfortable? (Mannerisms, appearance, habits, etc?)
- 2. How do you think you might have reacted to seeing John the Baptist or Jesus presenting their message in such different ways?

Challenge:

Be mindful this week of your interactions with other people. Are superficial things influencing how you value a person or what they have to say?

Tuesday

Subject: Freedom to Choose

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 6:12-20

Commentary:

In this passage, Paul is trying to correct people who have misunderstood what freedom in Christ means (See also: 1 Cor. 10:23). We are free from the law, but our choices still have consequences. Using our freedom for selfish desires is not why Jesus set us free. Doing so is destructive to us and others. Feeding these appetites quickly puts them in a position of power in our lives and we lose the very freedom we are meant to enjoy. Rather, freedom in Christ allows us to wrench our focus off ourselves, and follow His purpose in our lives individually and as His church.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Sex with prostitutes and eating food that had been sacrificed to idols were common parts of idol worship in Corinth when Paul wrote this letter. What kinds of things are culturally acceptable today despite being counter to God's design for our lives?
- 2. In what ways has Jesus set you free?

Challenge:

Write down one area where you may be feeding a selfish appetite, and one area where God might be prompting you to exercise the freedom He provides. Then pray and seek his direction in these two areas.

Wednesday

Subject: Heart not Status

Scripture: 1 Samuel 16:1–13

Commentary:

Samuel has been appointed by God to anoint the next King, but even he cannot guess which of Jesse's sons it will be. He is looking for a mighty warrior to lead Israel. God, who sees the hearts of men, chooses David though he is just a boy.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. We can't search the hearts of those around us like God can. How can we choose our leaders, employees, friends, etc?
- 2. Saul was still the king when Samuel selected David to replace him. Has someone's status or position intimidated you when trying to do something you knew was right?

Challenge:

Consider what it means to have your heart inline with God. Spend some dedicated time in prayer, discussing how you can increasingly become a man or woman after God's own heart

Thursday

Subject: Don't Sugar Coat It

Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 2:1-6

Commentary:

In this passage we get a glimpse of how Paul approaches his work of spreading the gospel. He is willing to confront opposition and ill treatment. He goes to great lengths to avoid being a burden to those he is trying to reach. He doesn't force or trick people into following God. In the end he is trying to please God rather than men, so he strives to stick to the truth and let God work in men's hearts.

Questions for further thought:

1. Have you ever experienced an incomplete or sugar-coated version of the gospel from someone who was trying to please others?

2. Have you felt the urge to change the gospel based on who you are sharing with? What pieces of the gospel made you uncomfortable?

Challenge:

Journal about your understanding of the gospel and what it means to share it.

Friday

Subject: Dangerous Hypocrisy

Scripture: Matthew 23:25-28

Commentary:

We can be very good at telling people one thing and doing the opposite. In ch. 23 of Matthew, Jesus is warning the disciples of the dangers of hypocrisy. Verses 25–28 show us that just because we clean up what others see does not mean that we are right with God on the inside. Jesus is reminding us that saying one thing and doing another will cause the people we are trying to win for Christ to become even further separated from God.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. In your experience, what ways are people hypocritical and still feel right with God?
- 2. How has another person's or your own hypocrisy caused you to stumble?

Challenge:

Take some time to discern how hypocrisy has affected your walk with God, and how you might avoid this pitfall in your own walk.
