YouVersion

Hillcrest is going to resume using YouVersion, an online bible, which includes a mobile app that allows you to interact with Hillcrest's sermons. To get started, download the app to your smart phone or tablet at https://www.youversion.com/mobile. Then during Sunday's sermon, open the app, click on "Live" (blue icon in the upper left hand corner), and type our zip code – 57103 in the search area. We will also try to post each week's link on Facebook before Sunday. Once you have accessed our event, you can read the scripture, take notes, send us prayer requests, even fill out your connection card. If you miss church on Sunday, you can also check out the event later in the week to hear a recording of the message. If you use this app, please let us know what you like or don't like about it. We appreciate any and all feedback.

Serve

July Outreach Focus – Abbott House

Instead of the Urban Plunge, Hillcrest will be partnering with Life 96.5 to support their mission focus for July, which is the Abbott House in Mitchell, SD. Abbott House is a private charity that provides residential treatment services to girls between the age of 7 and 18, who have little or no family support and who have endured extreme trauma, experienced abuse, or who have be diagnosed with depression, anxiety, or ADHD. The agency provides not only intensive treatment but also foster care in a therapeutic home.

During the month of July, the radio station will be doing a drive for Abbott House and will provide drop-offs at each of their "sticker stops." They will take donations for new or gently used jeans and sweatshirts, or new packages of socks and underwear in both girls' and women's sizes. We will also collect these items here at Hillcrest and deliver them to the station.

Hillcrest Ministries

Many volunteers are needed to make Hillcrest run smoothly every week. As the ministries get ready to start working on their schedules for the new school year, we want to invite everyone to get "plugged in" to whichever area fits them best. If you want to try something out before you make a commitment, just let us know. <u>Some</u> of the opportunities that only require a commitment of one Sunday a month include greeting, ushering, Worship Team, or helping out with Student or Children's Ministries. Title: Oh My God! Scripture: Exodus 20:7; Matt 15:8-9; Psalm 50:16-17; Revelation 3:8; Psalm 139:20; Jer 29:8-9

For those going deeper: This week's memory verse

Exodus 20:7 (NLT) "You must not misuse the name of the Lord your God. The Lord will not let you go unpunished if you misuse his name.

Monday

Subject: Swearing an Oath to Others Scripture: Matthew 5:33–38

Commentary:

Jesus understood human nature better than anyone. In this passage, He advises us not to make oaths or swear at all. We can't change or make anything happen. Therefore, make your yes, mean yes and your no mean no and say nothing else.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Why are we tempted to add "I swear" or "I promise" when we respond?
- 2. Does saying these words make any difference to how or what you do?

Challenge:

Respond to questions/asks of you without swearing or making an oath. Simply say yes or no.

Tuesday

Subject: Swearing an Oath to God Scripture: Numbers 30:1–2

Commentary:

How many times do you catch yourself saying "Lord, I promise never do that again"? Per these verses, vows must not be given or said rashly. Our word needs to be our word and although we mean well, we may be hard pressed to follow through when we make such vows.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What promises have you made to God?
- 2. Have you been able to keep all of them?

Challenge:

Ask for God's forgiveness for those promises you have not been able to keep.

Wednesday

Subject: Sound Advice about Oaths Scripture: Ecclesiastes 5:1–7

Commentary:

Instead of making a vow, sit still and listen to what and how God directs you. Let God tell you what to do, and how not to make the same mistake again. God doesn't need your oaths or words. He wants your heart and your obedience.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What do you need to take to God today?
- 2. Have you taken or made an oath about this in the past?

Challenge:

Take a different approach this time; confess and then listen for God's direction.

Thursday

Subject: Benefits of God's Wisdom Scripture: Proverbs 3:1-8

Commentary:

Some of the benefits of heeding God's wisdom are favor and a good name in the sight of God and man. God will make your paths straight and He will bring health to your body and nourishment. So, why don't we all seek His wisdom all the time?

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What are some reasons we don't seek God's wisdom?
- 2. What is typically the result when we don't seek God's wisdom?

Challenge:

For a current problem or concern, ask God for wisdom. Sit still and listen to God for wisdom and guidance.

Friday

Subject: Acting on What You Heard Scripture: Matthew 7:24-29

Commentary:

If God gives you wisdom or instructions and you do nothing with it, you are like the man who built his house on the sands. So, if you sit still and God's gives your direction, follow or heed the instructions to ensure your house is built on solid ground.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What wisdom has God given you lately?
- 2. Are you following it?

Challenge: Take a step forward on the path God has asked you to follow.
