#### YouVersion

Hillcrest is going to resume using YouVersion, an online bible, which includes a mobile app that allows you to interact with Hillcrest's sermons. To get started, download the app to your smart phone or tablet at <a href="https://www.youversion.com/mobile">https://www.youversion.com/mobile</a>. Then during Sunday's sermon, open the app, click on "Live" (blue icon in the upper left hand corner), and type our zip code – 57103 in the search area. We will also try to post each week's link on Facebook before Sunday. Once you have accessed our event, you can read the scripture, take notes, send us prayer requests, even fill out your connection card. If you miss church on Sunday, you can also check out the event later in the week to hear a recording of the message.

### July Outreach Focus - Abbott House

Instead of the Urban Plunge, Hillcrest will be partnering with Life 96.5 to support their mission focus for July, which is the Abbott House in Mitchell, SD. Abbott House is a private charity that provides residential treatment services to girls between the age of 7 and 18, who have little or no family support and who have endured extreme trauma, experienced abuse, or who have be diagnosed with depression, anxiety, or ADHD. The agency provides not only intensive treatment but also foster care in a therapeutic home.

During the month of July, the radio station will be doing a drive for Abbott House and will provide drop-offs at each of their "sticker stops." They will take donations for new or gently used jeans and sweatshirts, or new packages of socks and underwear in both girls' and women's sizes. We will also collect these items here at Hillcrest and deliver them to the station.

#### Hillcrest Ministries

Many volunteers are needed to make Hillcrest run smoothly every week. As the ministries get ready to start working on their schedules for the new school year, we want to invite everyone to get "plugged in" to whichever area fits them best. If you want to try something out before you make a commitment, just let us know. Some of the opportunities that only require a commitment of one Sunday a month include greeting, ushering, Worship Team, or helping out with Student or Children's Ministries. You could even sign up to be a substitute for any of these areas. Lots of other volunteer opportunities are available during the week, too. ## Commentary:

To meditate in God's word, is to discourse with ourselves concerning the great things contained in it, with close application of mind and fixedness of thought. We must have constant regard to the word of God, as the rule of our actions, and the spring of our comforts; and have it in our thoughts night and day. For this purpose no time is amiss.

Subject: Lord if thou wilt

Scripture: Mark 1: 40-45

## Commentary:

We have here Christ's cleansing of a leper. It teaches us to apply to the Savior with great humility, and with full submission to his will, saying, "Lord, if thou wilt," without any doubt of Christ's readiness to help the distressed. See also what to expect from Christ; that according to our faith it shall be to us. The poor leper said, If thou wilt. Christ readily wills favors to those who readily refer themselves to his will. Christ would have nothing done that looked like seeking praise of the people. But no reasons now exist why we should hesitate to spread the praises of Christ.

# Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you doubt God's readiness to heal?
- 2. Are you readily referring yourself to God's will?
