For those going deeper:

<u>This week's memory verse</u>

1 John 3:15 (NLT) Anyone who hates another brother or sister is really a murderer at heart. And you know that murderers don't have eternal life within them.

Monday

Subject: Me, a Murderer? Scripture: Genesis 4:1-8

Commentary:

It is easy to dismiss the commandment, "You must not murder," as being one that most of us will never consider breaking. It is interesting, however, that after the original sin of Adam and Eve, the next sin we see in the Bible is the murder of Abel. It appears that the impulse to take another life—and the emotions that lead up to the act—may not lie as far beneath the surface as we believe.

Questions for further thought:

- God knew where Cain was headed and tried to turn him in another direction. What do you think drove Cain to go ahead and kill Abel anyway?
- 2. Honestly reflecting on your past, have you ever been so angry with someone that you imagined killing them?

Challenge:

This week, identify any people in your life who are, or have been, the object of your intense anger. When you think of them, does your anger flare again? That's a sure sign that forgiveness hasn't happened yet. Ask God to help you to truly forgive them, and release yourself from the cycle of anger that comes from unforgiveness.

Tuesday

Subject: Leave the Accounting to God Scripture: Romans 12:19–21

Commentary:

It was true for Cain and it's often true for us. Anger overcomes us because we feel we've been wronged. Life isn't fair at home, at work, or_____ (fill in the blank). We feel the need to get back in some way at those we perceive to have wronged us. We strike out in anger, achieve our goal of revenge—and somehow don't feel any better for having taken that route. God is aware of injustice, and it's His job to square the accounts. Our job is just the opposite—to show God's love to those who treat us poorly.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you had adversaries in life that have treated you unfairly? How have you generally reacted?
- 2. Speaking practically, how would you practice treating your enemy with respect in your everyday world? Think workplace, classroom, family—even church.

Challenge:

"That's not fair" says our child to us as parents. And we respond, "The world isn't fair." Yet when we don't get the job promotion we deserve, the house that we hoped for, the health we strive for, or the life we dreamed of we respond "That's not fair." Psalm 73:3: For I envied the arrogant when I saw the prosperity of the wicked." Been there? I think we all have. Read through to the end. God's got this.

Wednesday

Subject: The Killer in the Mirror Scripture: Matthew 5:21-24

Commentary:

Jesus consistently turned matters of law into matters of the heart. In this passage, he does the same with murder. Though murder does bring judgment, so does anger—even if we never act on it. Anger is a reflection of an attitude of the heart, whether it be resentment, pride, jealousy, or any of a number of related emotions. Jesus lets no one off the hook, making the point that there is no room for anger in a heart fully in tune with God.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. In what situations do you most frequently become angry?
- 2. Do you believe that there is such a thing as harmless anger—like when we're just blowing off steam? Why or why not?

Challenge:

This week when you experience anger- at your job, in your home, driving the car- take your hands and make the heart sign. This will cause you to think about anger as a heart issue and turn it over to God.

Thursday

Subject: The Antidote to Anger Scripture: Matthew 22:34-40

Commentary:

Our natural tendency as fallen people is to become angry when wronged. Jesus, however, called on us to follow a different path when he summed up the second five commandments by saying, "Love your neighbor as yourself." It appears love is the antidote to anger, as it is hard to harbor anger against yourself. When we truly put ourselves in the place of others, and love them as we would want to be loved, anger fades away.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. When is it most difficult for you to put yourself in someone else's situation?
- 2. Can you think of someone in your life, past or present, who seems to embody this "loving your neighbor" attitude? How do they live it out?

Challenge:

My mom used to say, "Don't say what you will do until you are in the other person's shoes." This week when you encounter someone who is walking a life that is inconsistent with the life you desire for them, consider their circumstances. A soft heart is a kind heart. Be kind.

Friday

Subject: Power to Change Scripture: Galatians 5:16-25

Commentary:

Living a life focused on loving others rather than ourselves is possible, but not easy. We can't do it in our own power, but we don't have to because Christ sent the Holy Spirit. In Galatians, Paul contrasts life lived on our own with life lived in the power of the Holy Spirit. Quarreling, jealousy, and outbursts of anger are the product of a life lived apart from the Spirit's power. Contrast those with the fruit of the Spirit: peace, patience, kindness, and self-control. There is power to change when we allow the Spirit to lead us.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. When you read this passage in Galatians, do you see these fruit of the Spirit in your life, or are jealousy and anger more prevalent?
- 2. What practical steps might you take to make yourself more open to the work of the Spirit in this area of your life?

Challenge:

Identify the fruits of the spirit that are evident in your life without you even trying to produce them. Ask a friend for help if you need to. Then, identify those you struggle with. Fruit needs tending to and so do the fruits of the spirit. Feed and water these fruits, practice them on the people God brings into your life this week.
