Monday

Subject: In the Image of God

Scripture: Genesis 1:26-28

Commentary:

Day six was the climax of God's creation because it was the day man was created. Man was created in God's image, and was imparted only to humans. Being in God's image means that humans share in God's nature, that is, in His attributes (ie. Life, personality, truth, wisdom, love, and holiness). This gives us the ability to have spiritual fellowship with Him. God's purpose in crating human life in His image was for us to have dominion over all the earth.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Why did God wait until day six to create the human race?
- 2. What was the significance of the fact that of all creation God only has a relationship with humans?

Challenge:

It is hard to image that God created the entire earth with everything in it in only 6 days. Meditate on all the details that were required to form the entire earth.

Tuesday

Subject: Stand up for Your Faith

Scripture: Hebrews 10:35-39

Commentary:

The writer of Hebrews encourages believers to persevere in their Christian faith when facing persecution and pressure. We do not usually think of suffering as good for us, but it can build our character and our patience. When we are put in situations when we need to defend our belief in creation as opposed to evolution it sometimes seems we are persecuted for our beliefs. We need to have confidence in our faith and what we believe as true. Rest in the comfort that God is sovereign and everything was created by Him.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you have a response for why you believe what you believe regarding creation?
- 2. What scripture can you quote that will convey your source of faith in what you believe?

Challenge:

With our education system teaching evolution it seems we are losing the battle to teach our children the truth about how we came into being. Have you taught your children or others why you believe what you believe about creation?

Wednesday

Subject: Calming the Storms

Scripture: Mark 4:35-41

Commentary:

In this passage Jesus shows his humanity, in that he was so exhausted from preaching to the crowds that day that he fell asleep. It also shows Jesus authority because even the winds obeyed him. After Jesus commanded the winds to be quite he rebuked his disciples for being afraid despite Jesus' tutoring it still had not dawned on them that God's authority and power were present in Jesus. This is what he meant by his question, do you still have no faith? Their question "who is this" that even nature obeyed his commands must have shocked them.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How can you explain that the weather men cannot accurately predict the weather next week, but can claim to know what the weather will be in 100 years?
- 2. How much influence does God Have in the weather?

Challenge:

We are told that we are ruining our environment with our life styles and innovations. Why do opinions of global warming have such varying viewpoints?

Thursday

Subject: Unclean!

Scripture: Leviticus 13: 45–46

Commentary:

It is sometimes hard to find examples of science in the Bible, however, God uses specific instruction at times to convey how certain illnesses needed to be addressed. In Leviticus we are told that a priest did not function as a doctor to prescribe medical treatment. He functioned more like a public health official who would isolate a person with a contagious skin disease. The patient was basically left to natural healing processes to cure his condition, during which time he was isolated outside of camp. It was the responsibility of the person to yell "unclean" when someone came near so they would not be infected if it was a contagious condition.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How do we in our society prevent the spread of disease?
- 2. What do you do to try and protect yourself from getting or spreading illnesses?

Challenge:

Although the Bible doesn't give a lot of examples of how to prevent the spread of germs, we can take some lessons from the Bible. Think about ways you can protect yourself and your family from getting sick this winter.

Friday

Subject: Preserve Life

Scripture: Isaiah 44:24-26

Commentary:

We read in Isaiah that God forms us in the womb and has made all things. The Lord as Israel's redeemer is the creator of all things including the heavens and the earth. He is also the one who makes false prophets, and supposedly wise people look foolish. At the time there were those who said God could not release His people from Babylon, however, they were proved false when God's predictions were fulfilled. Those who believe that it is okay to kill unborn children will one day stand before God and give an account for their actions and beliefs.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What is the best way for us to try and convince someone that an unborn child is really a living human being?
- 2. What are some ways we can confront people with humility and love?

Challenge:

God will not be mocked and He will not stand by forever as this nation kills His unborn children. We need to pray for those who perform abortions and that God will convict their hearts and allow them to know that the unborn children are human beings and worthy of preserving.
