Hillcrest's October Mission Focus is Feeding South Dakota. We'll be taking an offering for the Backpack Program during the services on Sunday, October 11th. It costs approximately \$150 to sponsor a backpack for the school year. Each Friday, Feeding South Dakota backpacks go out to under-resourced students throughout the region, ensuring students have food to make it through the weekend. A representative from Feeding South Dakota will also be here on Sunday, October 11th.

Title: You've Got to Do Something

Scripture: James 1:19-27

For those going deeper:

This week's memory verse

Colossians 1:10 (NLT) Then the way you live will always honor and please the Lord, and your lives will produce every kind of good fruit. All the while, you will grow as you learn to know God better and better.

Monday

Subject: Anger Destroys

Scripture: James 1:19-20, Psalm 37:8,

Proverbs 14:29, Eph 4:26-28

Commentary:

Of all the things in the human heart, anger may be one of the most intense, destructive and unhealthy emotions that we can experience. If not handled in the proper way, it can have drastic consequences. Anger may be caused by the pressures of work, family or even from being an innocent victim of another's wrongdoing or slander. Left unresolved, anger creates an intense desire to destroy something or someone.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you harboring anger today?
- 2. How are you attempting to deal with it?

Challenge:

Pray for God to soften your heart. Pray that you can find someone to confide in to give you direction and clarity to see the situation in a light that maybe you hadn't thought of before.

Tuesday

Subject: Purge Evil

Scripture: James 1:21, Romans 12:21,

Colossians 3:8

Commentary:

Paul tells us in the Colossians passage to rid ourselves of unsavory words and emotions. Good advice. But in the Romans passage he continues in instructing us to not only get rid of evil practices but to actively combat evil by overcoming it with good.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you been hurt by someone and retaliated by gossiping about them or slandering them?
- 2. Do you have the strength to not seek revenge but to build up those who you consider enemies?

Challenge:

This is a real challenge. To not seek revenge, to truly love your enemies is really foreign to our human nature. Pray for the Spirit to help you not to seek to harm but to build up, regardless of what evil has been done to you.

Wednesday

Subject: Words are Cheap

Scripture: James 1:22-25; 2:14-26,

Matthew 15:8-9, 1 John 3:18

Commentary:

St Francis of Assisi said "Preach the Gospel at all times, and if necessary, use words." It is relatively easy to fall into a routine of hearing and studying the Word, but putting it into action is another story. When we are asked to sacrifice our time, money or comfort we often fail in putting our faith into action.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you recently said no to something you feel God has placed on your heart?
- 2. If you said no, what was the reason?

Challenge:

Personally, when I say no to the Spirit, it is usually for selfish reasons. "I don't have time", or "I don't have the finances", or "It is not in my skill set or comfort zone". We all have our reasons. But as Christians we must be a people who say "Yes" more often than we say "no".

Thursday

Subject: Watch Your Mouth

Scripture: James 1:26, Psalm 35:28; 37:30,

Proverbs 15:2; 21:23; 18:21

Commentary:

It doesn't require a lot of deep spiritual training to realize that mastering your tongue is a good thing. Yet many (most) of us fall into a pattern of wounding those around us by not being careful in what we say. The concept is stated pretty clearly in Proverbs- Wise people learn to tame their tongues and fools don't. Remember, what you say echoes throughout eternity. Make sue they are favorable echoes.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Can you think of a time when you deeply wounded someone by your words?
- 2. What did that feel like and what did you do to remedy the situation?

Challenge:

Pray for the wisdom to be discerning in your speech. It often feels really good to get others on your side in a disagreement, but it is easy to tear others down in the process. Don't get caught up in those situations.

Friday

Subject: Transformation

Scripture: James 1:27, Matthew 6:24,

Romans 12:2, 1 John 2:15-17

Commentary:

The values of this world include pleasure, fame and wealth. The values most important to Christians include loving God and loving others in serving them out of gratitude for what Christ has done for us. While one value set doesn't necessarily exclude the other, it is usually very hard, if not impossible to remain true to Christ while pursuing the pleasures and riches of this world. The Holy Spirit convicts us of our errors in the choices we make that put us at odds with the values we are pursuing.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What are the most important things you are striving for?
- 2. Are these things drawing you closer to Christ or pushing Him farther away?

Challenge:

Pray for the Spirit to renew and transform you into a person who seeks after those things that give glory to God. Use your time, resources and talents to bless those around you, thus displaying the fruits of the spirit.
