

Hillcrest's October Mission Focus is Feeding South Dakota. We'll be taking an offering for the Backpack Program during the services on Sunday, October 11th. Each Friday, Feeding South Dakota backpacks go out to under-resourced students throughout the region, ensuring students have food to make it through the weekend. Subject: Courage Scripture: Proverbs 28:1

Commentary:

The wicked flee when no man pursueth,.... Through the terrors of a guilty conscience, as in Cain and others; who fear where no immediate cause of fear is, are frightened with their own shadows; and as Gaal was with the shadow of the mountains, he took for an army of men, as his friend told him, Judges 9:36; they are chased with the sound of a shaken leaf, and fancy men are at their heels to destroy them, and therefore with all haste flee to some place of safety; (Gills Commentary)

Question for further thought:

1. Are you bold for Christ?

2. Do you teach your love ones to be bold for Christ?

Challenge: Do not flee; be bold.

Tuesday

Subject: Take Refuge Scripture: Psalms 118:8

Commentary:

Every answer to our prayers is evidence that the Lord is on our side; and then we need not fear what man can do unto us; we should conscientiously do our duty to all, and trust in him alone to accept and bless us. Let us seek to live to declare the works of God, and to encourage others to serve him and trust in him. Such were the triumphs of the Son of David, in the assurance that the good pleasure of the Lord should prosper in his hand. (Matthew Henry)

Question for further thought:

1. Are you living life to declare the works of God?

2. Are you encouraging others?

Challenge:

Believe that God's love for you will never falter?

Wednesday

Subject: Scripture:

Humility Proverbs 27:12

Commentary:

Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth,.... Men should do those things which are praiseworthy; and should do them openly, that they may be seen and praised for them: for it is honorable to have such a character as Demetrius had, who had a good report of all men; and as the brother had, whose praise in the Gospel was in all the churches. To be commended by others, by any but a man's self, is to his credit and reputation; but nothing more hurtful to it than selfcommendation.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you do things that are praiseworthy?
- 2. Do you rely on others for self-worth?

Challenge:

Find time to teach praise to others.

Thursday

Subject: He will sustain you Scripture: Psalm 55:22

Commentary:

"Thy burden," or what thy God lays upon thee, lay thou it "upon the Lord." His wisdom casts it on thee, it is thy wisdom to cast it on him. He cast thy lot for thee, cast thy lot on him. He gives thee thy portion of suffering, accept it with cheerful resignation, and then take it back to him by thine assured confidence. "He shall sustain thee." Thy bread shall be given thee, thy waters shall be sure. Abundant nourishment shall fit thee to bear all thy labors and trials. As thy days so shall thy strength be. "He shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.(treasury of David)

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you assured God will sustain you?
- 2. Do you lay your burdens upon the Lord?

Challenge:

Meditate in God's word this week.

Friday

Subject:Stand firm in the faithScripture:1 Corinthians 16:13

Commentary:

Be strong – Put forth all the vigor and energy which God has given you in maintaining and propagating the truth, and your spiritual strength will increase by usage. The terms in this verse are all military: Watch ye, **ypnyopeite**, watch, and be continually on your guard, lest you be surprised by your enemies; keep your scouts out, and all your sentinels at their posts, lest your enemies steal a march upon you. See that the place you are in be properly defended; and that each be alert to perform his duty.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you watch for opportunities to do good?
- 2. Do you watch over each other in love?

Challenge:

Be strong - Put forth all the vigor and energy which God has given you.
