Title: Doing Good

Scripture: James 2:14-26

John 14:12 (NLT) "I tell you the truth, anyone who believes in me will do the same works I have done, and even greater works, because I am going to be with the Father.

Monday

Subject: Faith without action

Scripture: James 2:14-16

Commentary:

When you see a couple together, how do you know they are in love or committed to one another? You look for evidence or sings. Do they treat each other the same or different from other people in their life? How much time do they spend together? Do they do nice things for each other? How do they talk to one another and about each other when they are apart? All of these actions help determine their connection. Faith is the same way. There should be a connection to what we believe and how we act.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Consider the people you love. How do you treat them compared to strangers?
- 2. What do people see in your actions?

Challenge:

Do something today to demonstrate your love toward someone in your life.

Tuesday

Subject: More than knowing

Scripture: James 2:17-19, Mark 1:23-24

Commentary:

Many people claim to have knowledge of God or things of faith. What good is head knowledge if it doesn't translate into motivating our heart to action? In Mark an evil spirit speaks out to and calls to Jesus of Nazareth stating I know who you are—the Holy One of God. He recognized that Jesus was from God and asked if he was going to destroy him. He had knowledge of who Jesus was. Head knowledge is not enough. James tells us faith without action is dead. Our faith needs to produce deeds (action).

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you have head knowledge or heart knowledge of Jesus? Explain.
- 2. What deeds do you have to show this?

Challenge:

Take a look at your schedule for this week. What does it tell you about where your heart is?

Wednesday

Subject: Abraham's belief

Scripture: James 2:20-21, Gen 22:6-11

Commentary:

Abraham was called by God at age 75 to go to the land God promised him, where he would become a great nation. God promised him his descendants would outnumber the stars in the sky. At age 100 his son Isaac was born. Some time later God asked Abraham to take his only son to Mt. Moriah and to sacrifice this son. Abraham was ready to follow through on God's request when a animal was provided for the sacrifice. Abraham trusted God and took the steps of obedience to follow through on God's request to this long awaited son. Abraham believed God, credited his righteousness to Him. This was proved out through his actions of obedience.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How do you respond to requests from people? From God?
- 2. What requests do you need to respond to now?

Challenge:

To believe is one thing, to act on that belief is quite another. Abraham is a great example of putting faith into action. Have you taken that first step of faith to believe?

Thursday

Subject: Faith plus works?

Scripture: James 2:22-24, Romans 10:9,

Gen. 15:6

Commentary:

The Roman scripture says if you confess with your mouth Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be save. So is our faith enough? James tells us that Abraham's faith and actions were working together and his faith was made complete by following what God asked him to do. A person is justified by what he does and not by faith alone. To be justified means to be restored to a right relationship with God, just as if you had never sinned.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What is your reaction to this James scripture?
- 2. What does justification mean to you?

Challenge:

We are saved by our faith in God at the confession that Jesus is Lord and belief that God raised Jesus from the dead. We become right with God, then we live out that belief through our actions.

Friday

Subject: Faith without works

Scripture: James 2:25-26, Joshua 2

Commentary:

In Joshua we read the story about Rahab, the prostitute. She protects the Joshua's spies from the King of Jericho. After she has hidden the spies, she tells them she recognizes their God is the Supreme God. She requests protection for her family when they return. James tells us that Rahab was considered righteous for what she did for the spies. James concludes by telling us that faith without evidence is dead. Our belief in God should produce results that are evident to others. We should be changed by our faith and that faith should produce changes that can be seen by others.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Have you followed Romans 10:9? Have you confessed and believed in Jesus?
- 2. What evidence is there for others to see?

Challenge:

As people of faith, followers of Jesus-we should be moved to act. We should desire to serve God and His people. We should love His people and want to help them. What are you doing to live out your faith? Listen to announcements or check the bulletin for opportunities for you to live out your faith.
