

November Outreach Focus - Food to You

Hillcrest is excited to start a new mission focus with Food to You, which is a Mobile Food Pantry for individuals and families in need of food. They offer government commodities, produce, bread, pastries, and assorted frozen food. It is a grocery-style distribution, with the families taking the food home to be cooked and consumed. Hillcrest's own Nick Welder is the Executive Director of Food to You.

On November 19, 2015 at Augustana Lutheran Church, Hillcresters are invited to volunteer to assist with the distribution of food. They need 18 – 22 volunteers (6th grade and older) for the distribution, starting at 5:15pm, as well as 4 – 5 individuals to help unload the truck and set up the room, starting at 4:15pm. Please sign up at the Welcome Center if you would like to volunteer.

Food to You also offers a Food of the Month every month. For November, they need Peanut Butter collected and donated for the distribution. Please drop off donations near the outreach bulletin board in the front foyer by Sunday, November 29th.

Scripture: James 3:1-12

Proverbs 13:3 (NLT) Those who control their tongue will have a long life; opening your mouth can ruin everything.

Monday

Subject: How to Seem Smart

Scripture: Proverbs 17:27-28; 21:23

Commentary:

How many of us have said something and, while the words are still hanging in the air, wish we could reel them back in? Unfortunately that's not how it works, which is why this advice is so valuable. As this passage says, it is always best to consider our words carefully before we let them come out of our mouth. As the old saying goes, "Better to remain silent and let others think you a fool than to open your mouth and confirm the fact."

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Can you think of a situation where you said something that you immediately regretted?
- 2. How can we improve our ability to consider our words before we speak them?

Challenge:

Keep a list this week. On the list, write down instances where you spoke words you now wish you hadn't. Also, write down times where you considered your words and made a better decision—either to use different words or hold your tongue.

Tuesday

Subject: The Power of Words

Scripture: Proverbs 18:19; Matthew 12:26

Commentary:

The quickest path to offense is through words. We have to understand power of words to offend, and that power has been multiplied dramatically thanks to technology. In today's culture, the words need not be spoken but can be sent electronically in a message, posting, or blog—devoid of inflection and open to interpretation. In the world of social media, offense is almost impossible to contain. Rather than the offense only involving a "brother," it may be taken up by thousands of strangers.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Many people today seem to think that it's ok to say whatever they want wherever they want. Does that thinking seem consistent with what the Bible teaches?
- 2. How well do you guard your words, considering the power they have to change lives and relationships?

Challenge:

This week, take a look at your use of social media. If you use it to take in or pass on anything but positive information, reconsider your approach. If the media you're viewing seems to be pushing you in a negative direction, consider fasting from it for a week—or longer—and substituting more positive inputs.

Wednesday

Subject: No, it's Not "Sharing the Details"

Scripture: Proverbs 26:20-24

Commentary:

It's gossip, the "permissible" church sin. It takes many forms, but the intention is never positive. Gossip is fuel for conflict. Often the gossip appears to be interested in spiritual good; but like a "pretty glaze covers an earthen pot" the hateful person "covers their hatred with pretty words" (NLT). Check your motives before sharing a prayer concern—or any personal information or opinion—that would be better kept in confidence.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Why do we find gossip so irresistible?
- 2. When you come upon a conversation centered on gossip, what is your reaction? Do you disengage as quickly as possible or find yourself drawn in? Or do you attempt to redirect the discussion?

Challenge:

Before you enter your week, decide how you will respond to the gossip you will certainly encounter. Will you excuse yourself, or will you take an active stand to redirect the conversation? Both are better approaches than participation.

Thursday

Subject: Speaking Life

Scripture: Proverbs 16:24; 25:11-13;

Ephesians 4:29

Commentary:

As damaging as thoughtless or intentionally hurtful words can be, words of praise, instruction, and encouragement can be life changing. Because of the way that God has changed our lives, we should have a positive outlook on this life. We have the opportunity to be agents of encouragement, serving as a conduit for the love and hope that Jesus can bring. Let our words be the life that so many need each day.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Can you think of a person in your life who has been a consistent source of encouragement to you?
- 2. Do you find yourself in a positive environment most days? If not, how can you remain/become a source of hope?

Challenge:

Each day this week, identify at least one person in your world who could use some encouragement. Be that encourager.

Friday

Subject: A Voice for the Voiceless

Scripture: Proverbs 31:8-9

Commentary:

The Bible is clear that God has a special concern for the poor, the powerless, and the oppressed. So should His church. Because we understand that every individual is incredibly valuable to God, we are in a perfect position to come to the defense of those who can't defend themselves. Using our voices to seek justice honors and pleases God.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Can you think of an everyday situation where you may be called to speak up for someone in a powerless situation?
- 2. If you encountered a situation like the one above, what might keep you from speaking up?

Challenge:

Consider what standing up for those who are oppressed might look like in your daily world. Consider the action you might take—whether by speaking directly into a situation or supporting others who are helping to seek justice or support for those who have no resources. Then, take that action.
