

November Outreach Focus - Food to You

Hillcrest is excited to start a new mission focus with Food to You, which is a Mobile Food Pantry for individuals and families in need of food. They offer government commodities, produce, bread, pastries, and assorted frozen food. It is a grocery-style distribution, with the families taking the food home to be cooked and consumed. Hillcrest's own Nick Welder is the Executive Director of Food to You.

On November 19, 2015 at Augustana Lutheran Church, Hillcresters are invited to volunteer to assist with the distribution of food. They need 18 – 22 volunteers (6th grade and older) for the distribution, starting at 5:15pm, as well as 4 – 5 individuals to help unload the truck and set up the room, starting at 4:15pm. Please sign up at the Welcome Center if you would like to volunteer.

Food to You also offers a Food of the Month every month. For November, they need Peanut Butter collected and donated for the distribution. Please drop off donations near the outreach bulletin board in the front foyer by Sunday, November 29th.

SCRIP Program

Now is the time when many of us start thinking about Christmas shopping! If you like to give gift cards, consider using Hillcrest's SCRIP Program to give back to 180 Student Ministries. It is an easy way to help out with expenses for student events and trips without spending any extra money. The way it works is that vendors give a portion of the money that you spend on gift cards back to Hillcrest. You can choose to assign your donations to a specific student or for the money to go to the general fund to help whichever students need it. You can also use SCRIP for other Hillcrest events. Title: Why We Fight

Scripture: James 4

For those going deeper:

This week's memory verse

Titus 3:2 (NLT) They must not slander anyone and must avoid quarreling. Instead, they should be gentle and show true humility to everyone.

Monday

Subject: Hatred

Scripture: Proverbs 10:12

Commentary:

Who do you hate? That is to say, who in your life puts the bur under your skin? Hatred stirs up strife, so is it our hatred for the other person that causes the "bur." If we were to show more love to the person bothering us, would they change? Maybe not, but we are demonstrating a Christ-like response that would change us. We all want the other person to change, but the greatest change usually occurs in us.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Is there someone you need to show more love to?
- 2. What are some ways you can love others even when they are putting that bur under your skin?

Challenge:

This week, find the person that is bugging you and resolve that conflict that is causing you to hate that person.

Tuesday

Subject: Change

Scripture: James 1:7

Commentary:

What is one thing that causes us to become irritated and creates conflict in our lives? It is change! How often do we become upset when we are faced with change? Great arguments in church are started by change. Should we change the carpet color, should we change from pews to chairs, etc., etc...... We do not like change at work, it causes us great strife. We do not like change at home, we like it just the way it is. Change: it is a large part of our lives; if there is one constant in our life it is change. James tells us that in the midst of change there is one constant, our Heavenly father, "with whom there is no variation or shifting shadow." Don't let change get you angry. Instead, keep your faith in God, who never wavers.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How do you handle change?
- 2. How does knowing that God, "never wavers" help you deal with change?

Challenge:

When change comes this week, give it to God and let him be in control.

Wednesday

Subject: Sing to the Lord

Scripture: Psalm 96:1-3

Commentary:

We always think of the Great Commission as a New Testament Idea, but Psalms 96 tells us we are to "Declare His glory among the nations". We are not just to proclaim God's glory in church, we are to, "Sing it day after day". When we leave the house, when we are at work, at school, at the gym, etc. Do your actions and attitudes show God's glory in your life every day? When you interact with that person who has rubbed you the wrong way at work, at school, or in the checkout lane at the store?

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What are some ways you can show God's glory to others?
- 2. How are you proclaiming God's salvation in your life?

Challenge

This week take time to share God's salvation in your life with another person.

Thursday

Subject: Who do you Serve?

Scripture: Matthew 6:24

Commentary:

Who do you serve, the Almighty or yourself? This question is a tough one, because we are by nature self-centered. Yet, in Matthew, we are told we cannot serve two masters. God is not at our beck and call; we do not get to choose when we serve Him. We cannot serve Him only when it is convenient for us. We must let Him be in control of every day, minute, and second of our lives. In the good times and the bad times, we must submit our lives to Him. This is a tough thing to do, but as we strive to follow Him we must give every effort to serve Him not ourselves.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Who do you serve?
- 2. Do you only serve God when it is convenient for you, or do you serve Him all the time?

Challenge:

What are some areas in your life that you need to give over to God?

Friday

Subject: Why Pray

Scripture: Revelation 5:8

Commentary:

Why do we pray? According to Revelation, our prayers are like incense to God. When we pray it is pleasing to God and is like incense to Him, so precious "the prayers of the Saints" are kept in golden bowls. Prayer is not a task you do before dinner, but rather a way to honor God. Do we only pray when we are at our wits end, or do we pray without ceasing? What an intimate way to worship our Heavenly Father by coming to Him in prayer. Does God need us to tell Him? No, but we need to be reminded that God already knows and is in charge. The best way is to go to pray and let him have the glory.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How have you prayed this week?
- 2. How does your heart change, when you go to God in prayer?

Challenge:

Pray often this week and remember your prayers are filling bowls in heaven.
