

Monday

Subject: The Thankful Leper

Scripture: Luke 17:1–19

Commentary:

In today's story, Jesus encounters a group of 10 lepers. Lepers were considered detestable, ceremonially unclean and were fully shunned by society as a whole. When the lepers began calling to Jesus, referring to Him as "Master", Jesus sent them away to show the priests that they were clean. Only one returned when he realized that Jesus had indeed healed him. This man, a Samaritan, was the only man of the 10 that returned to Glorify God and thank Jesus for the miraculous healing. Jesus was obviously disappointed that the other 9 had failed to return. This story reminds us that a lack of gratitude towards God for His blessings is sinful.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you have an attitude of thanksgiving?
- 2. If not, what will you do?

Challenge:

A life of thanksgiving is a life of prayer. Set aside time each day to thank God for His goodness. Reflect on Ephesians 5:20 as you get started.

Tuesday

Subject: Thankful for Family

Scripture: Psalm 127:3-5, Ephesians 1:5,

Colossians 3:18-21

Commentary:

When was the last time you told your spouse you are thankful for them? How about your children, parents, grandparents? Family is a gift from God. It is no mistake that He brought you all together. You are made to love, protect and support one another unconditionally. Unfortunately, sometimes we take these relationships for granted and our relationships suffer and disintegrate.

How about your relationship with God? He is your adopted Father. He adopted you into His family by the saving power of Jesus Christ.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you consider your family (your entire family) a blessing?
- 2. Do you consider yourself an adopted child of God?

Challenge:

Give thanks for your family. Make an effort to repair any problems between you. If you are struggling with the concept of being adopted by God, pray that Jesus would come into your heart and be Lord of your life.

Wednesday

Subject: Thankful for Work

Scripture: Ephesians 6:5-8;

Colossians 3:22-24

Commentary:

In his book, "The Purpose Driven Life", Rick Warren writes "work becomes worship when you are dedicating it to God and performing it with an awareness of His presence". Work is one of God's gifts to us. Adam and Eve were given the work of tending the Garden. We are made to work and for work. Many of us have made our work toil. Often it is performed solely for financial gain, not the avenue for worship and service that God desires. Instead of a blessing, we make it a curse.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you thankful for God's gift of work?
- 2. Is your attitude at work one of thanksgiving and worship?

Challenge:

It is a real stretch for many of us to think of our jobs as a blessing. Jesus is always there, maybe standing behind your boss, maybe in the midst of the really messy jobs. Try to envision Him. Hear him saying "I see what you do and I am proud of you and appreciate what you do".

Thursday

Subject: Thankful for Life

Scripture: Psalm 28:7, 69:30;

1 Thessalonians 5:18

Commentary:

Think about all the wonderful things this life has to offer. Beautiful sunrises and sunsets, a full moon rising on a clear winter evening, wildlife, a banquet table brimming with all of your favorite foods, a great movie shared with your favorite friend. The list is endless. God has provided endlessly beauty for us here on earth and the promise of endless beauty and joy in heaven. Yet we often overlook the good things in favor of complaining, coveting and sinning.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you truly thankful for your life?
- 2. If so, what will you do out of gratitude?

Challenge:

God gives you what you need, not necessarily what you want. Pray a prayer of thanksgiving, thanking Him for meeting your needs. Ask Him to help you be satisfied with the things He has given you.

Friday

Subject: Thankful for a Savior

Scripture: Psalm 118

Commentary:

This psalm is a psalm of thanksgiving and praise to God for His gift of salvation through Jesus. We are fortunate to serve a loving, compassionate God who loves us so much that He sent His Son to be the ultimate sacrifice of each and every one of us. There has been no greater gift given. Jesus is worthy of our gratitude and praise for His saving work on the cross.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Are you saved by the grace and power of Jesus?
- 2. If you are not sure, what will you do?

Challenge:

Glorify God by thanking Jesus today for His gift of salvation. Ask Him for the strength to live your life in a spirit of gratitude and thankfulness.
