Monday

Subject: A Life of Prayer

Scripture: 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4

Commentary:

Nothing needs to grow as much as our faith. "When Jesus spoke the words, "According to your faith be it unto you" (Matt.9:29, KJV), He announced the law of the kingdom, which tells us that different people have different degrees of faith, that one person may have varying degrees, and that the amount of faith will always determine the amount of one's power and blessing. If we want to know where and how our faith is to grow, the Master points us to the throne of God. It is in prayer, exercising one's faith in fellowship with the living God, that faith can increase. Faith can only live by feeding on what is divine, on God Himself. Christ Jesus is our life and the life of our faith. It is His life in us that makes us strong and ready to believe.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Am I a person who "doesn't understand or feel the need of spending hours with God?"
- 2. What can I do right now to change that mindset?

Challenge:

Let your faith placed in Jesus Christ propel you to seek His will as you go forward into your week. Let the words uttered by the helpless father in Mark 9:24 "I believe, help my unbelief" be your banner.

Tuesday

Subject: The Cure for Unbelief

Scripture: Matthew 17:19–20

Commentary:

Though faith is the simplest exercise of the spiritual life, it is also the highest. The spirit must yield itself in perfect receptivity to God's Spirit and become strengthened for this activity. Such faith depends entirely on the state of the spiritual life. Only when this is strong and in good health—when the Spirit of God has total influence in our lives—does faith have the power to do its mighty deeds.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Am I fully aware of all the power I am offered through faith in Jesus Christ?
- 2. What ways am I actively trying to mold my will to God's? What does that look like?

Challenge:

Try praying differently by introducing specificity to your requests. Keep a journal to write down the ways God is answering.

Wednesday

Subject: Eliminate the Drain

Scripture: 2 Timothy 2:1-7

Commentary:

If you had a hole in your gas tank, it wouldn't be long until you investigated why your tank is always empty. I just filled up, you say. Why am I drained again? The same thing happens in our Christian lives. We get filled up with great Bible studies and sermons and we think we're good for the long haul. But not far into the trip, we're out of gas. Completely drained. What happened? I believe one reason our spiritual strength drains quickly out of our lives is because we hoard it. That's right—sounds like the opposite would be true, but it's not. If we keep everything we gain in the Christian life to ourselves, we end up running out of gas. The apostle Paul mentions a bunch of reasons why we get spiritually exhausted in 2 Timothy 2, but let's focus on just one. I'll call it: "The Teacher Transfer Principle." Here it is: I must transfer the truth I've learned to others or it will drain away my spiritual strength.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How am I "hoarding" today?
- 2. When the last time I shared with another believer about what God is teaching me?

Challenge:

Take some time this week to discuss with another believer the things God is impressing upon you.

Thursday

Subject: Pathway to Peace

Scripture: Philippians 4:6-9

Commentary:

Have you ever been trying to get somewhere and you know where you want to be but you just can't seem to find the way to your destination? So many want to arrive at peace but have no idea what path will take them there. The starting point for the pathway to peace is the trailhead, if you will. Every trail begins with a trailhead and many trailheads have a little kiosk where you get information about what's ahead. Look in Philippians at the little kiosk Paul shows us so we can learn a little about the path ahead. It says, "Do not be anxious about anything . . ." The original word for anxious is a very interesting word. It means to be pulled apart. Would you agree that is what happens when we are anxious? Our hopes and dreams are over here on one side and our fears and doubts are on the other side. And this is literally pulling us apart. Depending on which side is winning this tug-of-war determines if we are on the pathway to peace. Lastly, make your petitions known with thankfulness, no matter what the situation is. In the middle of all your anxiety and worry, sweating and wringing of hands, thank God that He is already in the process of handling whatever the situation is.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Has this challenged how I would typically define "peace"?
- 2. How have I been pursuing the idea of peace? What do I need to change?

Challenge:

Be generous in your thankfulness and gratitude to the Lord and for all that He has done. See if pursuing this life of gratitude doesn't increase your peace.

Friday

Subject: Be Watchful

Scripture: Colossians 4:2-6

Commentary:

The Greek word for "continue" means "to be courageously persistent" or "to hold fast and not let go". Either way this appears to specifically reference that we are to be mightily persistent in our prayer life. So how are you doing in this area? As the passage continues, it references that we should "be watchful". Obviously, we are to stay awake while we pray, but could this be referring to something bigger? Is it possible that Paul may be talking about staying alert for specific needs about which to pray, rather than being vague and unfocused? When we get focused and serious about prayer is when the Lord shows up and our faith muscle is strengthened.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How am I being watchful about how I pray?
- 2. What could I change to make my prayers more "specific"?

Challenge:

Keep laser focus on your prayer petitions this week and see how the Lord works in and around you.
