Monday

Subject: Healed Scripture: John 5:8

Commentary:

Thinking back in your life as a Christian, you came to a point where you decided to no longer be a slave to sin and accepted Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. This is the point where Jesus says: "pick up your mat and walk", your willingness to serve the Lord outweighed your willingness to live in sin! Having this great healing helps you have faith and peace in your life.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What healing has the Lord done in your life?
- 2. If you need healing, what is holding you back from asking for it?

Challenge:

You have been healed, how is our daily walk with the Lord?

Tuesday

Subject: Palms and Robes Scripture: Mark 11:8-10

Commentary:

Jesus' Triumphant Entry shows that he was not afraid of what was going to happen. He did not avoid His enemies; He let them know He was there. What an encouragement to His disciples and to us. We need not be afraid of things but have courage and know that God is with us. Like it says in Romans 8:31; "if God is for us, who can ever be against us". Be triumphant and stand up for the Lord, do not be afraid.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Do you stand up for the Lord?
- 2. Why are you afraid if you know that God is on your side?

Challenge:

Stand up for the Lord at your work, school, or wherever you are today!

Wednesday

Subject: Everything Scripture: Romans 8:28

Commentary:

Everything.... that is a big statement. John states that God causes everything to work together, not just a random circumstance, one or two things, or one big thing, but everything. In our lives many things happen, big or small God will use them for our good and His purpose. In the daily rat race we get so caught up in the moment, in the small things, that we forget to look at the big picture and remember that God IS IN CONTROL. God uses everything for the good of those who love him.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What does everything mean to you?
- 2. Do you take time out of your busy schedule to see how God is working in your life?

Challenge:

Take some time and write down a timeline of things that have happened in your life, and see how God has used them to shape who you are.

Thursday

Subject: Upper Room Scripture: Luke 22 14-16

Commentary:

The Last Supper in the upper room is the last chance that Jesus had to speak to his disciples as a group. What a seen, Jesus washes there feet; he has the Passover meal with them and tells them one of their own will betray Him. Growing up the church I attended had an upper room were a Maundy Thursday service was held. This was one of my favorite services; you were not allowed to talk the whole time you were in the upper room. During the service, the pastor washed feet, the names of the 12 disciples were read a candle was lit for each disciple, except Judas, and communion was taken. The service gave you a lot of time to think and reflect on the great sacrifice that Jesus was about to make. How humbling is it to here Jesus say that He is eager to eat this meal, even when He knows the great suffering He is about to endure. The hope is that He also says He will one day eat this meal again.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How do you reflect on the sacrifice that Jesus made for you?
- 2. Have you made time for God this week?

Challenge:

Take time today to read the story of the last supper and spend some quiet time reflecting on it.

Friday

Subject: Today is Friday but Sunday is a coming! Scripture: Luke 23:44–46, 48

Commentary:

Today is Good Friday, they day that we reflect on Jesus's death. These verses describe His last breath and what happened. We are told that the people who witnessed his death went home in deep sorrow. His death on the cross caused those viewing it to take a closer look at who Jesus was and should cause us to do the same. Do we go home in great sorrow or with the hope that this is only Friday and Sunday is coming!

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Who is Jesus to you?
- 2. How is Jesus the hope in your life?

Challenge:

Join Hillcrest for the Good Friday service and take time for a closer reflection on Jesus.
