Monday

Subject: Confidence in God Scripture: Romans 4:20-25

Commentary:

Are you a doubting person? Doubt is a lack of confidence or assurance that God will keep His promises. I mean the promise is only as good as the one who makes it, right? Does God make good on His promises? Let examine that and see. God has promised to provide for us. Philippians 4:19 says, "And my God will supply every need of yours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." Maybe He hasn't provided all your wants but can you truly say He has not provided for your needs? God has promised to protect us. Isaiah 54:17 says, "No weapon that is fashioned against you shall succeed . . . This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord." Has He protected you even in the midst of struggle? How many things might He have prevented that I don't even realize? God has also promised to prosper us-though, as some are quick to add, that doesn't necessarily mean financially. But, Psalm 84:11 says, "No good thing does he withhold from those who walk uprightly." These are just a few of the hundreds of promises that God signed Himself in His Word. Dig in and see for yourself!!

Questions for further thought:

- 1. Am I a doubting person?
- 2. What am I struggling with most right now in regards to doubt?

Challenge:

Ask God to grow a heart of faith in you, because you can't do it on your own. Remember that faith is a gift (Ephesians 2:8). Go to Him humbly as the disciples did, and say, Lord, increase my faith!

Tuesday

Subject: Failure is not Final Scripture: Luke 22:31-32

Commentary:

Have you ever failed in a major and colossal way and wondered if God could truly ever use you in any meaningful way again? I know I have, and I have wondered if God could ever put me back together. Maybe, you have repented, turned from your sin and yet you have these feelings of self-doubt. You wonder if you'll do it again. God's grace and God's forgiveness is complete. It's a benchmark and He's able to use you, bless you, and restore you to wholeness as long as there's a repentant, dependent heart. Jesus said that to Peter. Jesus foretold Peter's betrayal in Luke 22:31–34. It's a wonderful thing. Jesus basically said, "Peter you're going to fail Me and let Me down." That's exactly what Peter did. He blew it. He denied the Lord who had spent three years with him. It tore his heart out, but Jesus put him back together. From a human perspective, Peter became the founder of this thing we call the church. Failure is not final. If you will confess and repent of your sin, God will cleanse you, restore you, put you back together and use you

Questions for further thought:

- 1. How often do I feel like God can't use me when I fail terribly?
- 2. Is there something I'm not confessing before the Lord because I think He won't be able to use me afterward?

Challenge:

Pray this simple prayer and believe He will be faithful in it.

Heavenly Father, forgive me for my failures. I thank You that You will still use me to do Your will even after I have faltered and let You down. Thank You for Your unconditional love for me.

Wednesday

Subject: Choose to be a Water Walker Scripture: Matthew 14:27-31

Commentary:

Fear can be an overwhelming and distracting feeling. It affects the way we live, the choices we make, and it can prevent us from living life to the fullest. Peter was always the gutsy one among the twelve disciples, and as we learn from this passage, he wasn't about to hug the side of the boat, afraid of the storm, and fearful of the Son of Man walking on water. He was driven to move closer to Jesus, believing He was Who He said. In a bold move, Peter stepped out of the boat and walked on the water. Imagine that? Like the rest of us though, Peter wasn't able to ride the miracle wave very long before he had second thoughts. Why? He was distracted. And so often, that's how fear grabs hold our hearts – the daily distractions that take our focus off Jesus and give circumstances the ability to rob us of true faith. It creates a spiritual amnesia that can trick us into forgetting the miraculous things that Jesus has done moments ago. Remember, there were eleven boat huggers and one water-walker. Which one are you? Make the choice to get out of the boat and fix your gaze on the only One Who can keep you afloat.

Questions for further thought:

- How have I, or someone I know, stepped out in the past? How is God calling me to step out today?
- 2. Have I grown distracted and allowed fear to creep into my life? What miracles has Jesus done in my life that I need to remember? How will I trust Him today?

Challenge:

Take some time and take an inventory of how God has been faithful to you either in the present or in the past. Try journaling to capture some of these amazing truths.

Thursday

Subject: What to do with Doubt Scripture: James 1:5-8

Commentary:

You are not at the mercy of every doubt that comes to your mind. Like the waves of the sea, doubts will come. However, you do not have to let them undermine your faith. Doubts can actually drive you back to God's promises, rather than cause you to back away from Him. The key is taking your questions directly to the Lord. James, familiar with sailing on ships at the mercy of stormy waters, described doubt in those terms: "The one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind." Winds make the sea unstable. Waves move back and forth in a constant state of disruption. What wind does to water is what doubt can do to faith. Doubt will keep your life in stormy turmoil. So ask God for the wisdom to identify doubt and turn away from it. Ask with the humble faith of the man who said to Jesus, "I believe; help my unbelief" (Mark 9:24), and step forward with confidence and the promised presence of God.

Questions for further thought:

- 1. What doubts in your life need to be obliterated by the majestic God you trust?
- 2. Where do you recognize the need for greater wisdom? Have you asked for it?

Challenge:

Take time today to read James 1 and ponder how the Lord might be asking you to step out in faith.

Friday

Subject: Uniquely Gifted Scripture: 1 Corinthians 12:12-27

Commentary:

Have you ever felt your role is not significant? Perhaps you can't see your part or you doubt it matters. Do not let your feelings dictate your reality. Even if you feel like you don't have a part, you do. Even if you can't see your place, it's there. You matter to God and to His church. You have a place and what you do is greatly needed. Try again—the church needs you. If we were all eyes, our body couldn't hear. If we were all hands, our body couldn't walk. After you talk to the Lord about it, embrace your gift, whatever it is, with your whole heart. Because "God arranged the members in the body . . . as he chose," we know there's no mistake or shipping error. You are perfectly suited for the tasks God wants you to do, and using your gift is your responsibility. You must *intentionally* pursue your place in the body of Christ. Eventually, you will find how He has gifted you and what you're good at. Every part matters! And when you find your place and begin serving His church, you will discover great joy.

Questions for further thought:

- What is your spiritual gift? If you don't know, how will you find out?
- 2. If you claim to believe in Christ, how are you currently using that gift to invest in His Kingdom?

Challenge:

Pursue a readiness to discover your spiritual gift and share it with the body of Christ.
